Our Reading focus this term includes-

Comprehension: Developing strategies to understand and interpret texts.

Summarising: Learning to identify key ideas and express them concisely.

Our Inquiry topic this term is titled 'How do celebrations and symbols help us understand Australia's history and identity?" The students ■ will explore events such as ANZAC Day, Australia Day and Harmony Day, as well significant Australian symbols and emblems such as the flag, the southern cross and the Coat of Arms to learn about their history and meaning. Through this using we hope to build an appreciation for Australia's diverse culture and heritage.

During SEL sessions this term the students will learn about having a 'growth mindset', helping them see challenges as opportunities to learn and improve. We will continue to explore the 'Zones of Regulation', which teach students to understand and manage their emotions in different situations. We will also focus on 'conflict resolution' and developing skills to solve disagreements in positive and respectful ways.

During Religion sessions, we will begin the term with a focus on relationships, where we will explore Jesus commandment to 'love one another', and how our choices affect ourselves and others.

We will then focus on discipleship - what a disciple is, and what being a disciple looks like today.

We will end the term with a focus on Lent and Holy Week.
