

## **MATHEMATICS**

In Mathematics this term, students will be investigating data, making connections between fractions, decimals, and percentages, and consolidating their knowledge of the four operations. These skills will help build confidence in problem-solving and support students to apply mathematical thinking to real-life situations.

To begin each maths lesson we will complete a, 'Daily Review' of concepts taught previously to support student's memory and retrieval skills. This review will incorporate a combination of topics that were taught the day before, the week before and in previous terms.

We encourage all students to consolidate their Times
Tables recall at home, making this a home learning
goal for Term 4.

Parents are encouraged to play a support role with this!

### SCIENCE

In Science this term, Year 6 students will be learning about biological science and how living things have changed over time, looking at fossils and scientific records as evidence. They will also explore how the features and behaviours of animals and plants help them survive in their environments. Students will discover that scientific knowledge grows and changes as new ideas are shared and built upon, helping us to better understand the world around us.

### **ENGLISH**

In English this term, Year 6 students will be working on a personal recount and a book study of a text of their own choice, encouraging them to reflect on and respond to what they read. They will also begin creating a memory book, capturing special moments and experiences from their primary school years. Students will explore a range of text types, helping them strengthen their writing skills and prepare for the transition to secondary school.

# **RELIGION**

In Religion this term, our Year 6 students will be exploring the themes of Creation, Reconciliation through Scripture stories, and the season of Advent. These units will invite students to reflect on God's presence in the world, consider the importance of forgiveness and healing in our lives, and prepare meaningfully for the celebration of Christmas.
