The **University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)** is an admissions test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their ***medical, dental, and clinical science*** degree programs. Students intending to apply for courses requiring the UCAT at any of these universities are reminded that they will need to **book a test**.

Bookings close 15 May 2026. The testing dates will be from 1 July 2026 to 5 August 2026.

The [Bachelor of Commerce](#) offered by RMIT has a range of majors, including the [Marketing Technology major](#). This major covers key areas including *marketing automation, digital marketing, and customer relationship management*, equipping students with both theoretical knowledge and practical skills.

Students learn about foundational marketing principles, as well as develop essential research skills to plan and implement effective tech-driven strategies. Students can also specialise in areas such as *AI in marketing, branding, and customer experience management*. The VCE prerequisites for entry are a study score of at least 25 in English other than EAL; or a study score of at least 27 in English as an Additional Language (EAL). In addition, students should attain a study score of at least 20 in one of Maths: General Mathematics, Maths: Mathematical Methods or Maths: Specialist Mathematics.

- UQ is a one of Australia’s leading research and teaching institutions.

The long-term structural shift in employment growth towards services-related industries is projected to continue over the next 5 and 10 years. [Figure 1]

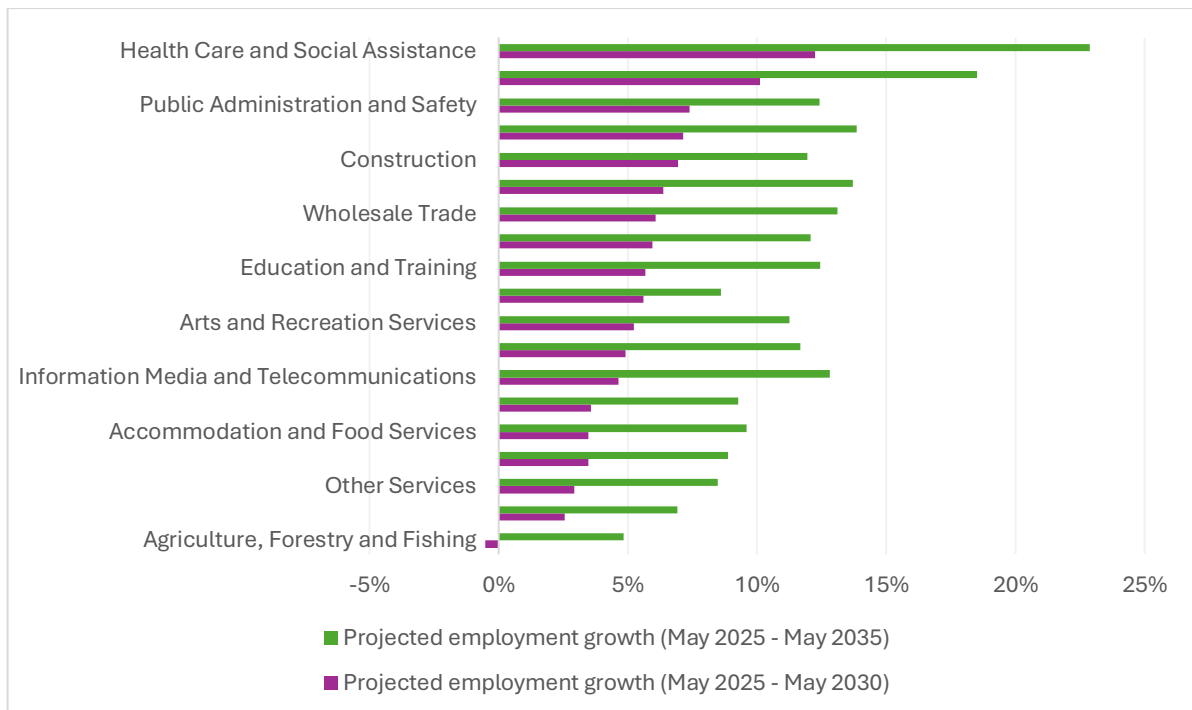

The table above [Figure 2] provides Industry - Employment Projections nationally, and a couple of factors are worth focusing on:

- Health Care and Social Assistance continues to be the largest employing industry
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services is predicted to be the second-largest employing industry

With this in mind, it is important to note that, in recent years, most employment growth has been seen in jobs that typically require **post-secondary qualifications**. The 2025 projections suggest that this trend will continue, with more than **90% of the employment growth over the next 10 years in these occupations (skill levels 1 to 4)**.

Skill Level 1	Bachelor's degree or higher qualification
Skill Level 2	Advanced diploma or diploma
Skill Level 3	Certificate IV or III (including at least 2 years' on-the-job training)
Skill Level 4	Certificate II or III
Skill Level 5	Certificate I or secondary education
