June 21, 2020 - 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Friends of slain teen Solomone Taufeulungaki paid tribute to their "gentle giant" as his devastated family stood where he was fatally stabbed, vowing to forgive his attackers less than 24 hours after his death.

The 15-year-old's father 'Atunaisa was overcome with grief and collapsed to the ground as he approached the scene with Solomone's mother, Salome and aunt on Wednesday morning.

Solomone, known as Solo, was fatally stabbed after he was attacked by up to 10 people outside Brimbank Shopping Centre in Deer Park in Melbourne's west on Tuesday afternoon.

Friends said Solomone was an "innocent boy" who may not have been the target of the fatal attack, which unfolded opposite his family's church - the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Solomone's mother described her son as humble, active and funny. "We don't want any justice," she said. "We want our son back home. We did not have a chance to see him last night so we wanted to come here." Both parents said the family had prayed and vowed to forgive their son's attackers. "Everyone dies in a different situation," 'Atunaisa said.

"Heavenly father needed my son to come back. We don't know who is their [the attackers'] family but we love them ... the parents don't teach bad things to the children. It's their children's choice."

It was 1976 when Elton John first sang the challenging yet insightful lyric: "Sorry seems to be the hardest word".

Yes, recognising we have done wrong, then framing and expressing an apology is never easy. And for the person who has been hurt, damaged or offended, accepting that apology can be even more difficult.

But offering genuine forgiveness, especially if an expression of sorrow or contrition is yet, if ever, to come, that's something which can be very "hard" indeed.

Following the horrific stabbing of 15 year-old Solomonne Taufeulungaki at a Deer Park shopping centre on Tuesday, the words of forgiveness uttered by the teen's grief-stricken parents had to be heard to be believed.

It's likely that many who heard their heartfelt words of forgiveness may have recalled the words of Jesus dying on the Cross: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do". (Luke 23: 34).

Christian faith, tradition and teaching puts enormous emphasis both on seeking forgiveness when we have done wrong, and on offering it when we ourselves have been wronged. But it is in the "Lord's Prayer" itself that we find the most powerful and specific

requirement for those who follow Jesus to be people of forgiveness. You know it already, of course, but it should still be printed here: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us" (Matt: 6:12).

Atunaisa and Salome Taufeulungaki are ordinary people who somehow have given an extraordinary witness to the capacity of their noble human spirits to find forgiveness in the most extreme of circumstances and of personal grief. We can honour them best - as we should - by trying to imitate their grace-filled example in our own lives.

First reading

Jeremiah 20:10-13

Jeremiah said:

I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side!" Denounce him! Let us denounce him!' All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, 'Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge! But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. But you, O Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them. for I have committed my cause to you. Romans 5:12-15

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. 
Gospel
