

UNIFORM POLICY

1. RATIONALE:

School uniform is compulsory for students attending Plenty Valley Christian College. This is a policy matter that parents and students agree to support by virtue of enrolment at Plenty Valley and a condition of ongoing enrolment.

A properly worn uniform:

- 1.1 Will enhance the school image and student pride in the College.
- 1.2 Is an indicator of a good school tone.
- 1.3 Is a means of student identification with the College community.
- 1.4 Allows others to identify our students.
- 1.5 Reduces clothing costs, fashion competitiveness and superficial individual differences.
- 1.6 Provides one avenue through which students may learn and express respect for communal standards.
- 1.7 Uniform is one expression of the College's legitimate boundaries.

2. POLICY:

- 2.1 Students will wear the College uniform as stipulated by the College when attending the College or officially representing the College.
- 2.2 Students may only wear the elements outlined in the uniform code unless they have specific permission from the principal.
- 2.3 The College may allow non-uniform days, limited exemptions, or variations at the discretion of the principal.
- 2.4 The uniform code or items may be amended from time to time at the discretion of the principal.

3. CODE:

- 3.1 To protect the uniform standard, all items of the College uniform, except for shoes, white socks, and team sport's uniform, should be purchased through the College uniform shop or from the college.
- 3.2 The wearing of a correct College uniform is compulsory and described by the following guidelines.

4. GENERAL:

4.1 Standards:

- a) The principal's interpretation of the College policy and regulations vetoes all others.
- b) The uniform fabric and design standards are held for reference at the uniform shop.
- c) Students are expected to wear a clean, neat, and tidy uniform as determined by the principal.
- d) Shirts and blouses are to be tucked in when worn with the winter uniform; short-sleeved shirts may be worn untucked as part of the summer uniform if no other uniform top is being worn. Jumpers are not to be tied around the waist.
- e) Dress and skirt lengths must be at knee-length, meaning an acceptable range, as determined by the Head of Sub-School, close to the top of the kneecap.
- f) Students may not wear any other visible clothing under their dress or sports uniform (e.g.: T-shirts)

4.2 Summer uniform period is Terms 1 and 4. Winter uniform is worn in Terms 2 and 3. There will be a three-week overlapping period for wearing summer and winter uniform depending on the weather, at the parent's and student's discretion. This will only be at the beginning of Terms 2 and 4. Further variation is at the discretion of the principal.

4.3 Secondary school blazers must be worn in public and to and from the College (locker areas) with the winter uniform. Blazers are to be worn as the outer item over the formal uniform in summer and winter on formal occasions. The jumper or rugby top may be worn as the outer garment to and from the College in summer.

4.4 Navy coloured beanies, gloves and scarves are permitted to be worn with the winter uniform while students are outside in very cold weather. Beanies and gloves should be removed upon entering a room.

4.5 Shoes are to be black, leather, lace-up school shoes. Prep to Year 2 students may wear a Velcro strap shoe. Prep to Year 6 may wear a black leather T-bar shoe.

4.6 In Terms 1 and 4 the wearing of the College sun hat or cap is compulsory when undertaking lessons outdoors in direct sunlight, including specified Physical Education classes or sport events. Primary students must also wear the hat while outdoors during recess and lunchtimes. Secondary students should be strongly advised to follow this practice also.

4.7 Breaches of the uniform code or policy will be communicated with the student and parents in accordance with the appended PVCC Secondary Uniform Breach Procedure that may change from time to time.

5. PE AND SPORT:

5.1 Sports uniform must only be worn when timetabled PE and sport days for the student's class/year level.

5.2 Ankle socks are only acceptable as part of the sports uniform.

5.3 Secondary students must not wear a combination of dress and sports uniform e.g., Soft Shell Jacket should not be worn with formal uniform.

6. ACCESSORIES, GROOMING, AND INCIDENTALS:

- 6.1 Students should be neatly groomed.
- 6.2 Hair must be worn neatly, at all times.
 - a) Primary students with shoulder length or longer hair that touches the bottom of the collar must have it tied back securely using a tie in college colours as available from the uniform shop.
 - b) Students should avoid extremes in hair styles and colouring that is not a natural colour for humans.
 - c) Students should not wear their hair so that it obscures their face.
 - d) When students are engaged in activities that require their hair to be contained or tied back, they must comply with staff instructions before undertaking the activity.
- 6.3 Cosmetics – coloured nail polish, eye make-up and other obvious cosmetics are not permitted.
- 6.4 Jewellery that may be worn with the school uniform must comply with the following:
 - a) Students are encouraged to wear wristwatches; however smart watches are not permitted for primary students.
 - b) Ear jewellery may be small studs, traditional sleepers, or plain round earrings no more than 1 cm in diameter and 1mm thick. Not more than two items may be worn in each ear. Ear jewellery must be removed for safety reasons as required.
 - c) A single silver, clear or flesh coloured small stud may be worn in a single nose piercing (for secondary school only). This should not be a piercing in the septal cartilage near the upper lip.
 - d) No jewellery or other material is to be visible other than the ears or nose. Tattoos should not be visible.

Non-Uniform Shop Items

- If they fully comply with the Uniform Policy, items that may be purchased outside the uniform shop include:
 - plain white socks (no logos)
 - runners (sports shoes)
 - black leather shoes
 - girl's navy socks/tights (no logos)
 - accessories
- All other items available through the uniform shop must be purchased through the uniform shop.

Appendix 1

PVCC Uniform Breach Procedure

- 3.3 All staff will record uniform infringements. Secondary infringements will be placed on SEQTA.
- 3.3.1 Multiple infringements on one day will count as a single infringement for breaches that are not easily rectified.
 - 3.3.2 A report from SEQTA will be printed weekly and sent to all homeroom teachers.
 - 3.3.3 Each week, homeroom teachers will review the weekly report for their students.
 - 3.3.4 If a student receives two infringements within a few weeks, homeroom teachers will contact home to discuss uniform. This is a pastoral care call to determine if there is some obstacle to wearing correct uniform.
 - 3.3.5 If a student has three infringements within a few weeks or displays an unrepentant attitude, the Year Level Coordinator will contact the student and home. The consequence for the third uniform infringement is one lunchtime detention.
 - 3.3.6 If a fourth infringement occurs, the Head of Sub-School will contact the student and home. The consequence for the fourth uniform infringement is one after-school detention.
- 3.4 If a fifth infringement occurs during a term, the principal will contact the student and home. Consequences of increasing proportion may be applied up to and including the student being excluded from class and their enrolment being terminated.
