FOUNDATION SEWING STUDIO | WINTER WORKSHOP (5 DAYS, SYDNEY CAMPUS)

15 - 19 July | Sydney The Whitehouse Institute Foundation Sewing Studio Workshop provides individuals with an introduction to the application and modification of patterns, together with techniques to embellish and construct a complete garment. The Foundation Sewing Workshop is aimed at those wishing to gain patternmaking and sewing skills or those with an interest in fashion. The 5-day sewing workshop provides foundations to designing a garment for themselves using simple pattern modification techniques either by computer or manually. Then to be able to cut and make the garment using simple techniques that guarantee success. Participants will have access to all the technical equipment required for use during the 5-day course. During this workshop students will learn:

- Body measurement taking and pattern size adjustment
- Design development or selection
- Pattern interpretation and modification using either manual techniques or CAD (StyleCAD or Gerber AccuMark)
- Fabric selection, fabric properties and composition
- Fabric laying, pattern placement and cutting
- Garment construction techniques relevant to the design
- Garment finishing and pressing
- Trend Forecasting

Food Technologist

Consider this varied job, allowing you to continually explore and develop new ideas, and combines an interest in food and science What do they do? Food technologists are responsible for the research and development of new food and drink products. They also work to improve the quality of existing products, processes, packaging, storage, and safety of foodstuffs. If you're a hands-on person, with plenty of patience and persistence, you're knowledgeable about food and love science - this career could be right up your alley.

Duties:

- Ensure safe and hygienic conditions are maintained during processing, storage and packaging of food
- Check raw ingredients and processed food for nutritional value, safety and quality
- Undertake basic and applied research into aspects of food processing, food preservation, food quality, food deterioration, packaging, storage and delivery
- Check foods for colour, texture and taste
- Demonstrate products to clients, compare and report with other products on the market
- Develop new products and food standards, quality control procedures, and devise the techniques needed to produce these foods and maintain quality during storage
- Analyse results and experimental data
- Supervise and coordinate the transportation of foodstuffs, work of technicians, cleaning and maintenance of food processing machinery.

- Good Project and Time Management skills
- Make quick decisions
- Strong problem solving skills
- Communication skills verbal and written
- Attention to detail
- Able to work well under pressure
