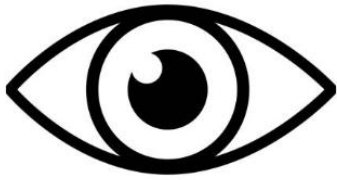

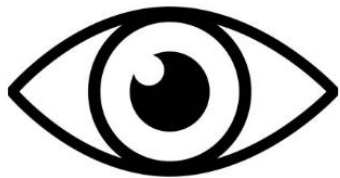

in primary school.



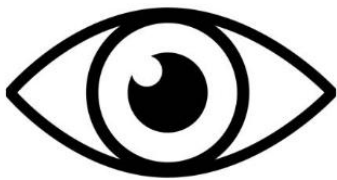
Having dyslexia means it is harder to:

Some amazingly famous people with dyslexia are:

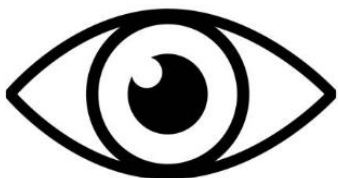
- Jamie Oliver- celebrity chef
