Tuckwell Scholarship for 2023

Australian National University (ANU) launched the *Tuckwell Scholarship Program* in 2013. *The Tuckwell Scholarship Program at the ANU is the most transformational undergraduate scholarship program in Australia.* A Tuckwell is not just about a students' intellect. It is also about their desire and determination to use their natural abilities to realise their full potential so that they can make a difference in the world. All up one could say, **this is no ordinary scholarship!**So, Tuckwell Scholar students will receive:

- \$22,350 per annum (2021 rate) (increasing with inflation) for each year of the length of their undergraduate degree, to cover on-campus residential costs, books, and general living expenses
- priority access guaranteed to ANU-approved student accommodation
- an annual allowance of up to \$2,000 to assist with their move to Canberra and to support
 two annual return journeys (e.g., airfares) between their home and the University for each
 year of their degree. The allowance will be dependent on the proximity of their family
 home to ANU.
- an allowance to help cover the transport costs for your parents to attend Commencement Weekend at the start of the program, and
- an ANU Sports Centre membership for the length of their degree.

Scholarships are awarded based on four criteria:

- academic potential and achievements to date;
- other significant achievements to date, of any type;
- demonstration of the Attributes of a Tuckwell Scholar; and
- a desire to eventually give back to Australia.

Applying for a Tuckwell Scholarship is a three-stage process which commences with an initial application from yourself and a recommendation from a schoolteacher. Applications will begin in March 2022.

Bachelor of Speech Pathology (Honours)

Federation's new <u>Bachelor of Speech Pathology</u> degree offered at the Ballarat and Gippsland campuses, will develop students' knowledge and core practical skills in anatomy and neurophysiology behind communication and swallowing impairments, the science of speech and hearing, linguistics, language, and healthcare. Students will also learn how to identify and implement appropriate therapeutic treatments and management options.

As a Speech Pathologist, students may work as a clinician, educator, researcher, policy advisor, manager, advocate or consultant in a variety of industries including government and non-government organisations, education, health, welfare, policy development, community-based organisations and private practice.

Bachelor of Nursing

The <u>Bachelor of Nursing</u> program offers a comprehensive curriculum and professional knowledge, preparing graduates to deliver the highest quality care to improve patient outcomes.

Subjects within this program include working with diverse communities, mental health, medical and surgical nursing as well as palliative care. Students will also learn leadership, management, and communication skills.

As a registered nurse, graduates may work in a range of areas including emergency illness, mental health, long-term care, intercultural health, and population health. Further study options are also available in health, midwifery and paramedicine.

> New Bachelor of Cognitive Enterprise

Combining Business and Information Technology disciplines, Federation's new <u>Bachelor of Cognitive Enterprise</u> has been created in response to future industry needs. This is a business course that combines the disruptive technologies including *AI, Blockchain, Internet of Things (IoT), 5G and Edge Computing with innovative processes and data, to enhance customer experience and gain competitive advantage.*

Career in Nuclear Medicine Technology

According to the <u>Your Career</u> website, *Nuclear Medicine Technologists* perform or assist in performing diagnostic examinations using radionuclides and radiopharmaceuticals, and administer radionuclides and radiopharmaceuticals for therapeutic purposes under the direction of Specialist Medical Practitioners. In other words, **Nuclear Medicine Technologists** are highly skilled *medical imaging experts* that use radioactive materials to diagnose physiological and metabolic changes within the body and treat diseases - Good Careers Guide.

This profession is best suited to people who -

- ✓ have an interest and aptitude in science.
- ✓ are able to work accurately.
- ✓ have a responsible and patient nature.
- ✓ have a sympathetic and understanding approach.
- ✓ are able to work independently or as part of a team.

Nuclear medicine technologists may perform the following tasks:

- Maintain and operate equipment such as gamma cameras and computing systems to acquire images and process and analyse patient data.
- Prepare and administer radiopharmaceuticals that demonstrate the function of organs in the body.
- Check the patient's medical status and ensure their comfort, privacy and safety needs are met during the procedure.
- Deliver findings of procedures to medical practitioners.
- Provide diagnosis and treatment for cancer patients.
- Perform laboratory procedures, including blood and specimen collection and quality control testing.
- Make sure that radioactive materials are handled, stored and disposed of in a safe manner.

- Perform routine quality control and testing procedures on instrumentation, radiopharmaceuticals, data, images, and computing systems.
- Initiate and participate in research programmes and in the development of new techniques.

A number of universities across the country offer accredited studies in Nuclear Medicine, and in Victoria students can study the <u>Bachelor of Applied Science (Medical Radiations)</u> at RMIT University. Nuclear Medicine is one of the streams students can choose to specialise in.

Career as a Firefighter

Every workday has meaning. Every workday makes a difference. Firefighting is suited to people with a genuine desire to serve the community, and who thrive on working closely in a team. Firefighters need to -

- have appropriate all-round strength and fitness
- exhibit problem solving skills
- demonstrate high level interpersonal skills
- genuine desire to work with the community
- have appropriate physical and psychological capability

There is a diverse range of roles available to firefighters, with great opportunities for specialisation and career progression.

Emergency response activities may include:

- suppression of all types of fires
- search and rescue
- high angle rescue
- road accident rescue
- emergency medical response (EMR)
- marine Response
- industrial accidents and hazardous material handling and storage incidents
- assisting other agencies in emergencies
- fire investigation analysis

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Community resilience activities may include:

educating the community about fire safety

• working with diverse community groups, across all age groups, to promote emergency prevention and preparedness activities through a variety of community resilience programs.

Other activities may include:

- training skills maintenance and acquisition
- involvement in exercises with the public through evacuation drills
- installing smoke alarms for senior Victorians
- participation in joint emergency training exercises (Victoria Police, Ambulance Victoria, Forest Fire Management and SES)
- building inspections
- checking water supplies, cleaning vehicles and maintenance of fire station.

Speech Pathology and Audiology Degrees In 2022

Speech Pathologists study, diagnose and treat communication and swallowing disorders, including difficulties with speech, language, fluency, and voice. Four Victorian universities offer an undergraduate degree in Speech Pathology, and these courses on offer are listed below. A number of these universities also offer graduate courses in speech pathology.

Audiologists are health care professionals who identify, assess and manage disorders of hearing, balance and other neural systems.

<u>Note</u>: The University of Melbourne offers a <u>Master of Speech Pathology</u> and the entry requirement for this course is the successful completion of an undergraduate degree in a relevant discipline (Science, Biomedicine, Linguistics, Phonetics, Education, Psychology).

The University of Melbourne also offers a <u>Master of Clinical Audiology</u>, and the entry requirements are an undergraduate degree in a relevant discipline (Science, Heath Sciences, Biomedicine, Linguistics, Phonetics, Psychology, Music), or equivalent.

Nursing - Division 2 (Enrolled) Courses in 2022

Division 2 or Enrolled nurses are trained with the full spectrum of nursing qualifications, and these skills include communicating with patients, working in a team, medication, and clinical nursing duties. These nurses are able to implement and monitor patient care, administer medicines, comply with infection control and work, health, and safety policies, perform clinical assessments and contribute to planning patient care. To become an Enrolled nurse, one must complete a Diploma of Nursing. The VCE entry requirement for the diploma is a Year 12 pass. On completion of the course students will be eligible to apply for registration as an Enrolled Nurse with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) or go on to further study to become a Registered Nurse.

<u>Note</u>: The Diploma of Nursing is currently a <u>Free TAFE</u> course.

Universities in Western Australia

There are *five* universities in Western Australia, one of which – the University of Western Australia – is a member of the Group of Eight universities.

1. Curtin University

Curtin University is a large multi-cultural university. It has a strong commitment to international engagement with Australia's third largest international student population. It maintains campuses in Malaysia and Singapore while also conducting face-to-face teaching in a number of countries. This cultural diversity adds a rich and valuable dimension to its campus atmosphere and also prepares the graduates to live and work in an increasingly global environment. Curtin is also fundamentally committed to providing regional education within Western Australia through a number of campuses and education centres spread across the state, but also has a campus in Sydney where it offers a range of business courses. Curtin University recently introduced undergraduate medicine.

2. Edith Cowan University (ECU)
