An integral part of the success of Live4Life is the Live4Life Crew. The Southern Grampians Live4Life Crew is a group of year 9 students from participating secondary schools across Southern Grampians including The Hamilton and Alexandra College.



The crew volunteer their time as mental health ambassadors, sharing positive mental health messages and challenging the negative stigmas associated with mental health, help seeking and help offering.

In February this year, during their induction, the Southern Grampians Live4Life Crew developed their own theme which aims to support, in a fun and creative way, their involvement in the Live4Life initiative in Southern Grampians.
