#### <u>ENGLISH</u>

Reading and Viewing

- · Continue to recognise uppercase and lowercase letters and sounds of the alphabet
- Continue to develop concepts of print-Where is the capital letters? How many words in the sentence?
- Continue to recognise the differences between a picture, a letter, a word and a sentence.
- Continue to develop positive reading routines and expectations
- Continue to build reading stamina

#### Writing

- Continue to practice correct letter formation

#### MATHEMATICS

In Mathematics this term children will be working on;

- Patterns and Algebra
- Sort and classify familiar objects and explain the basis for these classifications, and copy, continue and create patterns with objects and drawings
- Follow a short sequence of instructions
- Number and Place Value

Establish an understanding of the language and processes of counting by naming numbers in sequences, initially to and from 20, moving from any starting point Connect number names, numerals and quantities, including zero, initially up to 10 and then beyond

Subitise small collections of objects

Compare, order and make correspondences between collections, initially to 20, and explain reasoning

- Measurement and Geometry- Time
- Compare and order the duration of events using the everyday language of time
- Connect days of the week to familiar events and actions

#### - Money and Financial Mathematics

- Represent simple, everyday financial situations involving money

#### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

- God, Religion and Life
- Morality and Justice

Students will be given the opportunity to:

#### CONNECTED LEARNING

• Weather In My World - Earth and Space Science

During this term, children explore daily and seasonal changes in the weather through class routines and transitions. They make links to how the immediate environment affects them. They discuss and explore these changes through their senses and begin to create charts and drawings to represent them.

Children will:

- respond to questions about the weather using their senses to make observations and to explore how changes in the weather affect them
- link the changes in the daily weather to the way they modify their behaviour and dress for different conditions
- represent their ideas and share their observations and ideas about the weather through discussions and drawings
- learn how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander concepts of time and weather patterns explain how things happen in the world around them.

Learning and Teaching Statement: We believe that 'to Infinity and Beyond' promotes opportunities for students to experience the joy of discovery and to nurture their natural curiosity about the world and beyond. Science is a dynamic, collaborative and creative human endeavour arising from our desire to make sense of our world by exploring the unknown, investigating universal mysteries, making predictions and solving problems. Through science, students develop the knowledge, understandings and skills that allow them to become more informed and more able to contribute to culture and society.

#### HOME LEARNING

All students are encouraged to read for at least 10 minutes each night.

They can also practise reading their Busch words. New words will be added to the children's books when they have developed quick, automatic recall of their current words.

Students can also find these words in books, play games with these words or practise writing them if they would like.

All children have their Mathletics log in cards and can access the 'Mathletics' website for a recommended ten minutes a night.
