> New Bachelor Degrees from 2016

1. Bachelor of Foodies Studies

William Angliss Institute introduced the *new Bachelor of Food Studies* this year, and this degree is the first of its kind in Australia.

The focus of the course is to examine the complex relationship involved in developing healthy, sustainable, ethical food systems which deliver high-quality products from local paddock to global plate.

Students will also have the option to complete a fourth year of study specialising in Community Engagement. Students will work with an organisation to develop a research project in areas of food policy, food culture, sustainability and ethical food systems.

Gradates will combine their specialist food knowledge with business skills to enter a career as managers of sustainable food business, community engagement and food policy.

2. Bachelor of Resort and Hotel Management

The *new Bachelor of Resort and Hotel Management* commenced in February this year. This three year degree will prepare students for a career in the growing international resort and hotel industry. Students will complete subjects including resorts and hotel operations management, economics and revenue management, customer services and human resources management.

Students will also have the option to undertake a fourth year of study, specialising in either Professional Practice or International Practice.

Graduates will be equipped with the ability to lead and manage business operations and find innovative solutions to complex issues in the hotel and resort industry. This course also complements the *new* Angliss International Hotel School (AIHS) which was recently launched - Angliss International Hotel School. AIHS Diploma of Hospitality students will receive guaranteed entry into the second year of the William Angliss Institute Degree programs including the Bachelor of Resort and Hotel Management.



The UMAT2016 will be held on **Wednesday 27 July 2016**, and the results will be available late September 2016. Students should also note that results from UMAT2016 can only be used for undergraduate medicine or health science courses beginning in 2017 but not 2018. Students should not register for UMAT2016 unless they are planning to apply for a course commencing in 2017 and they meet the eligibility criteria specified in the UMAT2016 Information Booklet.

Career in Project Management

There are so many similar definitions or statements of what a project manager does, and one useful website* states that project managers ensure the project is completed on time and within budget, that the project's objectives are met and that everyone else is doing their job properly. Projects are usually separate to usual day-today business activities and require a group of people to work together to achieve a set of specific objectives. Project managers oversee the project to ensure the desired result is achieved, the most efficient resources are used and the different interests involved are satisfied. The website goes on to mention the typical industries project managers work or are employed in – construction companies, architects, software producers, commercial retailers, engineering firms, manufacturers, public sector organisations and aviation.

Career in Event Planning

The Job Guides indicates that an **event planner** or **event coordinator** plans and organises special events, including parties, wedding receptions, product launches, banquets, meetings, conferences and conventions. Successful event planners –

- enjoy working with people
- good organisational and time management skills
- have very attention to detail
- good interpersonal and supervisory skills
- good communication skills
- neat personal appearance
- comfortable working with computers
- able to negotiate, delegate and work under pressure

Depending on the size of the establishment, events coordinators may work independently or as part of a team. They often work irregular hours, and on weekends and public holidays. **Learn more at** <u>Job Guide - Events Coordinator.</u>
