#### INTRODUCTION

John XXIII College's Magis Gifted and Talented Program has continued to grow significantly in 2021, despite Covid denying us the opportunity for World Scholar's Cup, Jesuit National Debating or the Cultural Decoding and Julie Arliss Programs this year. Outstanding new ventures this year included the Intergenerational program with Mercycare, Famelab, and the Royal Commonwealth Society's Speech and Leadership Competition. In addition to the new programs, the college developed both its participation and success rates in top gifted and talented competitions including WADL Debating, British Parliamentary Debating, Da Vinci Decathlon, Ethics Olympiad, Speak for Faith, Creative Edge Challenge, Tournament of Minds, Mock Trials and International Debating.

In just its second year, the Magis-run House Academic Challenge competition continues to develop and flourish, with no fewer than 584 secondary students competing in between one and five challenges in the series, and outstanding participation at all six year levels. Congratulations to Koolyangarra which again won the premiership ahead of Loreto and a vastly improved St Louis, but all houses had some splendid performances over the series. Special thanks to House Coordinators, homeroom teachers, Magis and homeroom captains, and all student participants.


Other Magis-run competitions, the John XXIII Public Speaking, Creative Writing and Chess were all very successful with many superb performances in the Public Speaking heats and finals. Interestingly, the Chess Championship was totally dominated by boys, and the Creative Writing by girls, so we are looking at ways to overcome this including offering Scrabble as an additional competition which the girls may be more likely to show interest in.

There was a record 45 students at this year's Magis Camp which on the review questionnaire received an average mark of 9/10, with only one negative response. All sections of the Camp program received high accolades, and it was pleasing to see the keynote addresses of two Magis leaders, Skye MacMillan and Bella Pether being rated very highly indeed.

As the program continues to develop, many more teachers are now involved - a total of 36 as listed on the final pages of this Chronicle. They and the wonderful parent supporters, particularly in WADL debating and Creative Edge, and at the very successful Magis Awards Breakfast, have made superb contributions to the development of the Magis program in 2021. Warmest thanks to all student participants - your enthusiasm and talent has been inspiring, and above all the year 12 Magis leaders - a truly outstanding group that has given exceptional support in my four years at the college and to whom I am extremely grateful.

#### WADL INTERSCHOOL DEBATING

John XXIII College had a fine season in the WA Debating League's Schools Competition. Our venue was Christchurch and our ten teams competed against top colleges including Christchurch, MLC, PLC, Iona and Santa Maria in our divisions.

Our senior teams from years 11 and 12 had a mixed season with several forfeits either for or against impacting on the season. However they had an exciting final debate in the make-up round, with the year 11's just winning in a high quality debate. Unfortunately we had no year 10 team this year, but two excellent year 9 teams both of which had a couple of narrow losses and could easily have made the finals.

Year 7 and 8 teams were extremely impressive, with all six teams performing very well and three being outstanding. In year 8 Novice Division, Team One (Austin Vujcich, Oliver Grant Smith, Josh Tyson and Cooper Vincent) defeated our Team Two (Thalia Kurniawan, Amelia Watts, Matthew Gardner and Callum De Andrade) narrowly in the first round, then both went through the remaining four rounds undefeated, with Team One being undefeated zone champions and team two runners-up. Team one lost their first round of state finals narrowly.

The other exceptional team was the Year 7 Novice Team 5 which had an outstanding season, zone champions then going on to win three rounds of state finals, losing the WA Semi-Final to MLC on a split decision. The team consisting of Sasha Pallis, Charlie Pronk, Noa Mintz, Catherine Gazia and Tom Beach was coached by Ms Kirralee Dawson. (See photo with Dads on the facing page).




























## **MAGIS CAMP**

#### 2021 National Schools Constitutional Convention

Three very talented Year 12 Politics and Law students, Caitlin Green, Oscar Hegge and Benjamin Negus, were among a select group of students from around Australia attending the 26th National Schools Constitutional Convention (NSCC). Previous years, the National Convention has been held at the Museum of Australian Democracy at Old Parliament House in Canberra – but due to COVID restrictions, national delegates zoom called from their various state capitals. The Convention is supported by all state and territory Ministers and funded by the Australian Government Department of Education and Training.

As national delegates, representing Western Australia, Caitlin, Oscar and Ben were selected from over 800 students from government, independent and Catholic schools, most of whom took part in conventions in their home state or territory.

The topic of the 2021 Convention was 'Should the Constitution have a new preamble that would recognise our history, our aspirations and the many peoples and groups that make up our nation?' This topic provided students with the opportunity to explore the present Constitution and contemporary issues. Other elements of the program included a zoom call with the Governor General, David Hurley, and presentations from leading constitutional experts.



## **National Sleek Geeks Science Eureka Competition**

Three Year 7 students worked hard at preparing for the National Sleek Geeks Science Eureka Competition – a science communication prize organized by the Australian Museum. This year, students had to prepare a two minute video on the theme of "BIG" and our John XXIII students delivered in a big way. The topic that the students chose included:


- "Manipulating Atoms" by Phoebe Walsh (Year 7 St. Louis) the Big science on nanoparticles.





Congratulations to all contestants on the high quality of each talk and the Science department for their support of this important new Magis event.














