# Looking at the Readings

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is celebrated on 6 August. Yet each year we read the account of the transfiguration on the second Sunday of Lent. What is its connection to Lent? In the Preface for this Sunday we hear: "after Christ had told the disciples of his coming death ... he manifested his glory to show, even by the testimony of the Law and the Prophets, that the Passion leads to the glory of the resurrection." This preface is substantially different to the Preface for the Feast which focuses on the glory of Christ and the church.

The Lenten preface focuses on our journey to Easter with the prediction of Christ's passion and death that leads to his resurrection and glory. Like Peter, James and John, we need encouragement and glimpses of what is to come to both live out our Lent and endure the sufferings and sorrows of life. Moreover, the light of the transfigured Christ remains as our guide through Lent and his words to Peter and to us: "Be not afraid!" raises us up when we are down.

# The Transfiguration as a Mystery of Light

In 2002 St Pope John Paul II introduced the "Luminous Mysteries" to the Rosary, increasing the 15 decades to 20. The Mysteries of Light are based on the life of Christ in the Gospels. The fourth decade is the Transfiguration of the Lord.

# Liturgical Jottings Blessings I

In the first reading today the word "bless" is mentioned five times: God blesses Abram; Abram's name will be a blessing, God will bless those who bless Abram and the people will bless themselves. All in four short verses!

What are Blessings? In a word, God bestows his blessing by communicating or declaring his own goodness; his ministers bless God by praising him and thanking him and by offering him their reverent worship and service. Whoever blesses others in God's name invokes the divine help upon individuals or upon an assembled people. (Book of Blessing General Introduction #6c)

# **National Advice on Liturgical Implications in Light** of Coronavirus

Please take the time to read the insert in this weekends bulletin in relation to the Coronavirus. There are a number of recommendations from various departments including the Department of Health -

- \* Parishes should cease distributing Holy Communion from the Chalice until further notice.
- \* The Body of Christ only to be administered in the hand because of the high risk of transmission if people continue to receive on the tongue.

There are other recommendations listed following the advice of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference.

# <u>REFLECTION FROM FR PETER</u>

The Transfiguration is one of the more powerful stories and encounter we have in the Lenten Season, dramatic in presentation with a feeling of grandeur for the disciples with Jesus on the mountaintop. Peter, James and John are given a glimpse of what is to come in the resurrection.

Jesus appears with clothes like the sun, 'as white as light". There is much by way of symbolism through this story. The obvious one is the mountain ascended by Peter, James and John meeting with Jesus and where another hilltop experience would claim them through Jesus and his crucifixion, to his complete mountaintop moment.

So what about us in this story? We don't aspire to mountaintop experiences. Though if we have driven up mountains we know there is anticipation on all we will see and the view we take in once we reach the summit. It's like we have a glorified moment! We know from our own lives and the lives of ourselves as followers of Christ of those gone before us that the truly faithful life will cause us to have moments where God's presence is clearer and obvious to us. It's as if we have our motivation to 'camp in this place'!

Our prayer in this Lenten Season is to see where our 'peak' experiences in faith take us on the path where fullness of resurrection life awaits. So it's about seeing all that is worthwhile in living with our struggles and knowing the hand of God reaches out calling us onward. The other significant part of all this is by seeing the clothing we bring into our need covers us in the light of God's presence, similar to the Baptismal garment of putting on Christ and being proclaimed as a "new creation".

This week of Lent is one where through Caritas we see the presence of the Cambodian people through people like Phany generating enough income for her family as rice farmer. Phany like many of her people are finding to new transfigurational experiences to support themselves and with agencies like Caritas. May our Project Compassion giving this week be one where many can benefit from our generosity.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS
God calls all of us to leave behind our old ways and to follow him with a lively faith. God's desire for us are living with a stewardship offering new ways of life. As St Teresa of Calcutta once said .. "God does not call us to be successful, God calls us to be faithful".


Gospel - Matthew - 17:1-9
