	<b>Literacy:</b> Read every night and record at least 1 book on your PRC sheet. Talk with your parents about the books you are reading.  Tell your parents the <b>main idea of the text, sequence events</b> in order of beginning, middle and ending and <b>make predictions</b> about what could happen next. Discuss <b>real</b> and <b>make believe</b> .  Get them to sign that you have read it.	<b>Design and Technology:</b> Discuss how your home may have changed over time – extensions and changes in the way we live, washing machines, tv, ironing, cooking etc.  Design a menu with food from your family's cultural heritage. Perhaps cook the meal to share with your family.	<b>German:</b> Teach someone else how to ask and answer "Wie geht es dir? (How are you?). Find out the names of parts of the body to say "Mir geht es sehr gut!" or "Ich habe eine schmerz in meinem..."  Sing Heads, Shoulders, Knees and Toes in German.
	<b>Be Active / Sports</b> Go for a walk along the beach or skip along the sand.  Be active every day.	<b>The Arts:</b> Create a portrait by drawing or taking a photo.  Practise playing an instrument or make one of your own.	<b>Sharing the load:</b> Housework – Do some jobs around the house or garden.  Set the kitchen table for dinner.
