### **READING**

**Summary:** In both Year 3 and 5, the students in Reading are performing well above the State mean score.

The Year 5 Reading result is particularly impressive as we are growing our year 5 reading knowledge and ability to outperform the State and schools with Similar students and families to ours.

**Action:** Consistent documentation of the reading process for all classes especially in the Junior school and continue to strengthen reading comprehension skills for year 5 and 6.


**Intervention** and staff professional learning on effective literacy practice within the Instructional Model.

#### **WRITING**

**Summary:** In Year 3 Writing students were performing below the state. In Year 5 Writing students we performing well above the State.

**Action:** Consistent documentation of the writing using the Instructional model for lesson planning and delivery.

Focus with students on consideration of audience for their writing. Beginning pre-work for engaging with literacy consultant, Misty Adoniou in 2022.





**Summary**: In Year 3 NAPLAN numeracy shows the growth in achievement however, this is still below the achievement of other schools with students like ours.

In Year 5 Numeracy we are again above the State and the Similar school's measure.

**Action**: Problem Based Learning and Number talks PLUS Professional Learning Team planning. Learning Specialist Numeracy to work closely with the Junior School on Numeracy planning.

Professional learning for staff on mathematics content has contributed to this result.

### PARENT/STAFF/STUDENT SURVEYS

#### **Summary:**

**Parent Survey:** some improvement in school connectedness from 2020, significant improvement in parent community engagement from 2020 68% to 76%.

**Student Survey**: Students feel safe, like school and feel part of the community. School connectedness is slightly down from previous years.

**Staff Survey** reflects a need to improve the culture and whole school collaboration.

#### Action:

**Parent Survey:** refocus on student voice and agency, and continue to strengthen community engagement post COVID restrictions.

**Staff Survey:** Outlines teacher collaboration and feedback as a focus for improvement.

**Student Survey:** Increase in student voice and agency in how learning is structured and provide opportunities for enrichment and school connection.

**Student attendance** is above similar schools. Our students like to come to school and enjoy their peers.



- Student attendance is between 94-96%







# School Performance Data Sets for 2021 Based on Teacher Judgements against the Victorian curriculum.









### Learning Gain Year 3 (2019) to Year 5 (2021)







### Whole School Growth Data December 2020-2021










### F-2 Growth Data December 2020-2021










### 3/4 Growth Data December 2020-2021













#### Average Number of Student Absence Days


