Value: \$2,500 AUD

Open/Closing Dates: September 7, 2020 – November 26, 2020

The purpose of the Scholarship is to support students of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent, with a preference for Kimberley students, studying at the Broome, Fremantle or Sydney Campus of The University of Notre Dame Australia.

To be eligible for the Scholarship, applicants must:

- a. Be and state that he/she identifies as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person and is recognised by his/her community as a person of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent;
- b. Be enrolled or accepted for enrolment in an Undergraduate, Postgraduate or VET course at The University of Notre Dame Australia;
- c. Be undertaking their studies internally; and
- d. Be able to demonstrate that their educational opportunities are limited due to adverse circumstances as set out in the Selection Criteria.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Achievement Scholarships aim to encourage academically gifted Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who are either commencing or continuing their tertiary education at the University.

Applicants must:

- be an identified Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
- be able to demonstrate financial or other hardship based on the Equity Criteria
- be applying for any undergraduate degree at the University with an ATAR of 65 or above (or equivalent via the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Alternative Entry Program) or



 be currently enrolled in an undergraduate degree and have maintained a minimum GPA of 4 (pass average)

Value: \$7,500 AUD per year

- Able to demonstrate financial hardship. Applicants need to be in receipt of Youth Allowance or other means tested Commonwealth support.
- Relocating from a regional or rural area to study at Macquarie University.
- Studying as an internal student

Consideration is also given to applicants who, in addition to financial hardship, demonstrate any of the following:

- Capacity to triumph over hardship
- Indigenous background
- Carer responsibilities
- Geographic Disadvantage



- Non English speaking background
- Long term medical condition or
- Ongoing effects of abuse

Value: \$5,512 AUD per year

The Macquarie Education Costs Scholarship is an undergraduate equity scholarship awarded on the basis of need. It is designed to support recipients whose opportunities to study at university may have been hampered by situations out of their control.

All successful applicants will be able to demonstrate financial hardship. Applicants need to be in receipt of Youth Allowance or other means tested Commonwealth support. Consideration is also given to applicants who, in addition to financial hardship, demonstrate any of the following:

- Capacity to triumph over hardship
- Indigenous background
- Carer responsibilities
- Geographic Disadvantage
- Non English speaking background
- Long term medical condition or
- Ongoing effects of abuse

These scholarships are available for any undergraduate course and students can apply at any stage of their course. Students who have a completed Bachelor degree or higher award at a tertiary institution will not be considered for Macquarie equity scholarships.

Are you planning on working over the summer holidays this year? If so, the start of Term 4 is the ideal time to prepare yourself and start applying for jobs if you haven't already got started. Adverts for <u>Christmas Casuals</u> are already popping up and some of the closing dates are as early as mid-October. Businesses like to know they've got staff lined up and it gives them a chance to organise rosters, training, uniforms, and paperwork etc, so lots of the closing dates could be earlier than you might expect.

Our 5 top tips that could help you to prepare are:

1. Start preparing right now

- a. Decide how much time you'll have available to work during your holidays.
- b. Create or update your resume.
- c. Start your search and get applications in for any suitable jobs as soon as possible.
- By "suitable" we mean that they're:
 - Nearby and you'll be able to get yourself there and home ok and on time
 - You can commit to the hours, and
 - You're confident that it's a role you can see yourself doing for the whole summer (and maybe beyond if you're lucky).

2. Your resume and cover letter definitely do matter

Your CV and cover letter are likely to be the first contact you'll have with the organisation hiring you, and making a great first impression could really count in your favour.

Ensure all your details are up to date, that your skills and experience are all listed, and remember to show a little bit of your personality.

Also it pays to take a little extra time to tailor your applications to each specific job you're applying for.

3. Find the right opportunities

Start your search early, if you leave it until the end of Term 4 lots of vacancies may already be closed. Work out what kinds of jobs and hours you're willing to do, then look for positions that match your requirements.

4. Make sure you're work ready

Before you can start working and most importantly get paid, you'll need to make sure that you've got a few important things organised.

- They include:
 - Tax File Number (TFN)
 - Bank Account
 - Super Account

Do you know about your rights and responsibilities? Take some time to read about them before you sign any contracts. You could also brush up on some basic workplace health and safety guidelines if you have the time.

5. Put in some time and effort

It's best to assume that every job you apply for will receive tonnes more applications as well, so if you want to land a great job then you'll need to put in a bit of work that could give your application a boost and stand out.

Approach every application and interview with a positive and professional attitude. If you don't make an effort to write a personalised cover letter or complete the entire application, if you submit documents after deadlines or turn up to interviews late and unprepared, you won't be making the best impression on employers and could end up missing out on the job.

Remember to always follow up - even if it's just a "thank you for your time" message.

What do Aged Care Workers do?

Aged Care workers help elderly people to live in happiness, comfort, and with dignity. By helping them to carry out activities and personal tasks they'd be unable to do – or struggle with – by themselves.

If you've got bucket-loads of compassion and patience, and you're looking for a career that will be active and rewarding working as an Aged Care Worker could be ideal for you.

About you:

- Be positive, respectful and empathetic at all times
- Have the patience to communicate effectively with your clients, listen to them talk and be able to read between the lines
- A great multi-tasker who can switch between jobs and prioritise effortlessly
- Think on your feet, reacting appropriately and professionally in any situation
- You'll need a high level of stamina both physically and emotionally, to support, empower and advocate for your clients

The job:

- Carry out a variety of domestic duties and help your clients with mobility and personal hygiene
- Provide companionship and support (physical and emotional)
- Arrange social activities for your clients, help them to take part, get them there and back safely
- Run errands, engage with family members, ensuring clients are safe and well in all aspects of their lives

- Whilst this isn't a job where you can work from home, there are lots of part-time and flexible working opportunities. There's also a variety of places you could end up working, including in the community within your client's own home.

Aged Care Workers are most in demand in these locations:

Due to our ageing population, there is already a huge demand for Aged Care Workers and it's predicted to keep on rising. Currently listed as the third most in demand career (<u>August 2020</u>), there are jobs within this sector Australia-wide.

How to become an Aged Care Worker in Australia

Most employers prefer that you have a relevant qualification and the necessary checks to enter a career in Aged Care.

Step 1 – Successfully complete Year 10 with a pass in English.

Step 2 – Get some work experience in the field to see if it's a career you'd really love to do. Experience will also look great on your resume when you're applying for jobs. You could volunteer at aged care facilities or within your community.

Note: This may not be an option during the pandemic as the health and wellbeing of vulnerable elderly is a priority. But there are still ways you can get involved and help to care for the elderly within the community, e.g. <u>Care Army</u>, <u>Volunteer Australia</u>, <u>BUPA</u>, <u>Meals on Wheels</u>

Step 3 – Find a course that will provide you with the necessary qualifications. E.g.:

Certificate III in Community Services with TAFE or another RTO

<u>Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing)</u> with TAFE or another RTO

Certificate IV in Ageing Support with TAFE or another RTO

Some courses can be carried out as blended learning with the lessons online and practical placements on-site.

Or you could find a <u>traineeship</u> that will provide you with the qualifications and work experience whilst being paid. You might even be able to start a <u>traineeship while you're still at school</u>. **Note:** If you are under 18 and you'd like to apply for some these courses, your enrolment form may need to be signed by a parent or guardian. (Minimum age 16).

Step 4 – You may have to complete practical training as an element of your qualification e.g. 120 hours within a community care and residential care setting, which you'll be assessed on.



Step 5 – Obtaining a <u>National Police Check</u> may be a requirement of volunteering and work placements, you'll definitely need one before you can start working.

You might also be required to get a first aid certificate and do a manual handling course.

If you'd like to be based in the community or care for the elderly in their own homes, you'll probably need a drivers' license too.

Step 6 – Once you've started working and got some experience you can apply for various roles within Aged Care from operational to management positions. You could even train as a nurse or physical therapist.
