

# **Careers & Pathways**

As we look towards Term 2, there are lots of exciting events that will be taking place at MGSC.

# <u>Year 9</u>

The My Career Insights (MCI) program (also known as "Morrisby") will commence in early Term 2 for all Year 9 students. My Career Insights will help students to:

- Learn about what skills and abilities they could bring to a career.
- Find out about what jobs match their abilities, interests and personality, and the subjects they need for those jobs.

As part of the My Career Insights program, students will have free access to:

- Complete a series of online questions and quizzes on the Morrisby website at school (or at home if it cannot be completed at school).
- Receive a Morrisby Profile Report showing the results from the questions and quizzes, which summarises their individual strengths and interests and suggests related career paths and study options.



• Have a 30-minute meeting with a Morrisby-trained professional Career Practitioner, who will explain the report to your child. Parents can attend this meeting.

Year 9 students will complete the initial online profiling activities on <u>Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> May</u> (Week 2 of Term 2), during **periods 1 to 3** inclusive at school.

Students will need to bring **fully charged device** to school on this day. As will be further explained to students at a Year level assembly, the profiling activities are NOT graded tests! They are simply activities that will help them to figure out their aptitudes and interests.

Then, during the weeks of <u>Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> June to Friday 13<sup>th</sup> June</u> (Weeks 7 & 8 of Term 2), each student will be allocated to a 30-minute one-on-one meeting with a Morrisby Career Practitioner, to "unpack" their report.



These meeting times will appear on the students' Compass schedule during Term 2.

Parents and Carers will need to provide consent for their student to participate in this program (no cost involved). Please look out for this event on Compass next week and provide your consent ASAP.

### <u>Year 12</u>

Term 2 will commence with all Year 12 students meeting with Ms Bouchier in a one-one-one catch up, so as to discuss their ideas and queries for their plans beyond Year 12.

Students will initially complete a Career Action Plan survey, which will form the basis of their meetings with Ms Bouchier and will guide their individual tertiary research.



Students will then continue to attend a series of briefings and information sessions, to further guide and grow their knowledge and understanding of how the tertiary education system works; how we apply for courses through VTAC (including SEAS, the 'special consideration application process); and how students might best research tertiary courses and pathways.



All resource material from briefings and information sessions will be shared with parents as well, so that families can work together during this exciting time.

## Trades & Tech Fit Expo

The Trade & Tech Fit Career Expo is back in 2025.

This event aims to highlight study and employment opportunities for female and gender diverse young people in years 7 to 12 in industries that are traditionally male dominated.



This expo is 100% hands-on, allowing students to design video games, lay bricks, weld, use a flight simulator, program a robot, safety test equipment, use power tools, learn to paint and more. It provides a safe and equitable space where students engage with tradies, apprentices, and industry professionals, providing insight into the breadth of career pathways where female and gender diverse people are underrepresented.

Last year, more than 2,500 students from 119 schools attended the expo. 96% of surveyed students said it helped them understand careers in trades and technology.
