Special consideration and scholarships

Please be aware that if you are applying for special consideration and/or scholarships, you may need to supply evidence such as:

school absences
financial disadvantage
rurality status
VCAA/NESA special provisions
a supporting letter from the school
a supporting letter from a health/medical practitioner
school/community involvement
a character reference.

It's also important to note that scholarships at some universities will close soon.

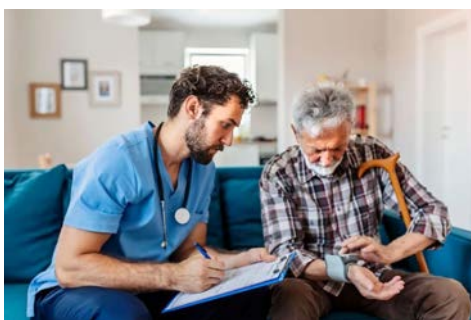
Additional forms, tests, auditions etc.

As discussed in the last Career News, you may need to complete additional tasks to be eligible for selection into your preferred courses. Please find the information repeated to the right.



Applying for courses via Tertiary Admission Centres (TACs)

Once you've completed your course application, check the inbox in your TAC account for information on additional selection requirements for your preferences. It's crucial you complete these requirements by the due dates otherwise you risk being ineligible for entry into the course.



Examples of additional requirements include:

Nursing and Midwifery

- Selection tests such as CASPer and the Basic Key Skills Builder Test.
- English proficiency declaration form.

Undergraduate teaching

- Selection tests such as CASPer
- ACU Teacher Selector Statement
- Teaching questionnaire

Design, acting, music, dance, fine arts, film etc.

- Audition
- Interview
- Folio
- Selection kit

Medicine, dentistry

- Interview
- Proof of rurality
- Direct applications to the institutes.
- Predicted ATAR form

- VTAC Personal Form
- Bridging subjects
- STAT test

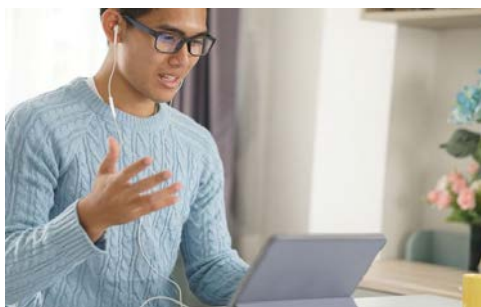
