About

The ultimate challenge of the Edmund Rice Readers' Cup is to read 13 novels vels in total. Participants begin this challenge by reading 10 novels: 5 from the Reading List and 5 of their own choosing to gain a Certificate of Achievement and 20 House Points.

Students have the opportunity to gain a higher Merit award and extra House points by reading further from the choices in the following awards:

Thomas Keneally [Bronze]:10 points C.J Dennis [Silver]: 20 points Francis Webb [Gold]: 30 points

These awards are named after three great Australian writers & poets: graduates of Edmund Rice schools.

Each time a student finishes reading a novel they are required to fill in the log sheet and have it signed by their parents and English teacher. When the participant has met the criteria for a Certificate of Achievement or higher merit award, this recording sheet should be handed to your English teacher before receiving final authorisation from the Year 10 Pastoral Coordinator.
