<u>Absences</u>

Regular attendance at school is very important for the development of learning, consistency of routines and maintaining relationships. Eating times

- **Brainfood-** Students are encouraged to bring cut-up fruit or vegetables in a separate labelled container to eat in the home group if they feel hungry and to keep energy levels up.
- **Lunch-** Students have 10 minutes of supervised eating after each outside break. All students are encouraged to have water bottles in the learning space and to refill them as needed.

Extra Curricular Activities

• Incursions and Excursions - Incursions and excursions will be provided to enhance learning in different curriculum areas. The cost of these activities has been covered by the Excursion Levy in the School Fees.

Home Learning

- Home learning activities connect to the learning that is happening at school.
- Distributed each week into their home learning book and through Seesaw.
- It will be distributed on **Monday** and collected on the following **Monday**.
- Students will be given a home learning book that will remain in their take-home reader folder (black folder).

Students will be given a home learning book that will have their login details to Matific and Sunshine Online. Students are encouraged to:

- Read for 10 minutes daily—a decodable book and/or passage. PM book, and library book.
- Work on Little Learners Love Literacy Spelling activities
- Practice mathematical problems from previously taught units and lessons.
- Visit Seesaw to make connections with learning activities

Please ensure that your child has the following items at school and that it is clearly labelled:


Headphones; Art smock; Black reader bag; Library bag; Colouring book; School Hat.
