





# MATHEMATICS

In Term Four we will be focusing on chance and its link to fractions, decimals and percentages. They will be revising BODMAS and their knowledge of the four operations. Students will be exploring capacity, mass and volume.

To begin each maths lesson we will complete a, 'Daily Review' of concepts taught previously to support student's memory and retrieval skills. This review will incorporate a combination of topics that were taught the day before, the week before and in previous terms.

We encourage all students to consolidate their Times Tables recall at home, making this a home learning goal for Term 4.

Parents are encouraged to play a support role with this!

#### **INTEGRATED STUDIES -INQUIRY MODEL**

This term the students will be exploring Business and Economics by participating in an Earn and Learn program. They will be looking at needs and wants, and reflecting on the choices business make. They will also identify the reasons businesses exist and investigate the various ways in which goods and services are produced and distributed. They will discuss the role and significance of conscience and reasoning in ethical decision-making within the context of business and economics.

# **ENGLISH**

During Term Four we will be participating in Literature Circles. Students will have the opportunity to discuss and reflect on their chosen text.

The students will be experimenting with different types of poetry and using these to create pieces for their Memory Book. The students will be analysing a range of fiction and non-fiction texts that related our Inquiry topic about Business and Economics.

# RELIGION

During Term Four, students will explore Morality and Justice. They will explain Discipleship and the responsibility we have to follow the teachings in the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes. They will reflect on the lessons these teachings contain and explore how these learnings can be lived out in a modern context. Students will spend time investigating the Advent Story to develop a deep understanding of the coming of Jesus as Christmas approaches. They will look at various aspects of the Advent Story, including the imagery, plot, setting, and author's purpose, and discuss how these elements combine to add meaning for us today.
