

## Team Leaders Report 2023

As the year draws to a close, we reflect on another great year for the P\&F with a full calendar of events and fundraisers in 2023, the first since 2019. While the core team was very small this year with only one team leader, what a successful year it was in bringing our community together in many different ways! Throughout the year 5 terrific Year level event teams coordinated some wonderful events for our community and many other volunteers coordinated big and small one of or ongoing events.

We got off to a great start in 2023 by announcing that funds from 2022 were able to purchase artificial turf, colourful, game inserts for the artificial surface which was laid in the school quadrangle at Easter time. While a grant funded much of the surface the colourful inserts funded by the P\&F, really enhance this area as an inviting and interactive play space for the students. The P\&F also paid for half of the cost of the new Long Jump and cricket pitch. As the turf became a late opportunity with the grant it was decided that as such the goal for 2023 continued to be to raise funds for new drinking fountains to be placed around the school.

We held our first two Special Food Days in Term 1 and our annual Pies and Hot Cross Buns Fundraiser was held towards the end of term and once again proved to be very popular. We commenced our weekly Friday Treats which continued right throughout the year. The biggest highlight of Term 1 and one also for the year was the return of the Cinema Night held at the end of term. While the weather was not kind, we were able to move to an indoor venue at St John's at short notice and a great night was had by over 600 people!
On the back of introducing the online payment system, CDF Pay late in 2022, we also acquired just in time for the cinema night a Square (EFTPOS) machine and later another one. These machines have made payments easy for parents/customers and greatly streamlined processes for the Treasurer, event coordinators and school Administration Staff.

Term 2 started with many events centered around the mums, including the Mother's Day Stall and Mother's Day Raffle as well as the beginning of our weekly Auskick BBQ's. The term also saw another Special Food Day supplied for by Aquinas Canteen. This time it was the return of the very popular pizzas and Aquinas mini pizzas in individual boxes were a hit with the kids and it was an efficient and easy for volunteers. Towards the end of term, we started promoting our Major Parent Social Night, A Masquerade Ball which was booked for the first weekend of Term 3, as well as the Major Fundraiser, the Online Silent Auction which runs alongside it.

Term 3 started with the Morning tea in the Community Centre as well as our Auskick BBQ's continuing.
The much-anticipated biggest parent event of the year, The Masquerade Ball, was held on the first Saturday back and attended by almost 150 people dressed in masks and their finery. With a great live band, roving magician, and a delicious paella dinner a great night was had by all. Alongside the social night we ran out Major Fundraiser, the Online Silent Auction which ran through 3-4 weeks and finished the day after the social night. With 45 items up for bids a total of $\$ 4500$ was raised to go towards our fundraising goals. Three Special Food Days were held, one a Pasta Day with a range of delicious pasta supplied by Aquinas College Canteen, a Subway Day and another Pie Day to coincide with Footy Colours day on the last day of term. Our Bunnings BBQ was held towards the end of July with a great profit being made
and the first week of September saw many dad centered events including the Father's Day Stall and Father's Day Raffle. We also saw the return of the indoor Father's Day Breakfast and saw a record number of well over 400 people attending over two sessions. The upgrading of a second BBQ and the purchase of a bain-marie made catering much easier for a group of dedicated volunteers and meant that lines for the egg and bacon rolls were a thing of the past! The term finished with the highlight of the kids calendar the School Disco, back at St James with the popular DJ Sam returning.

Term 4 started for the P\&F with another Morning Tea and Secondhand Uniform Stall which are held once or twice a term across the year. On the first day of November a term a team organised the Twilight Sports BBQ which was held at our school's much loved family event the Twilight Sports at Bill Sewart Reserve. Two Special Food Days were held this term, utilising the services of Aquinas Canteen once again and Subway in Bayswater.
We were also involved in running the St John's Parish Fete with our representative being head of operations, many St James Parents coordinating stalls and assisting with the raffle and others also volunteering on stalls, set up and clean up. We also ran the Bakers Delight Christmas Fundraiser selling tarts and Christmas cakes. This was in part as a thanks to Bakers Delight in Brentford Square who have been great supporters of our school across the year, donating free bread to many events and heavily discounting other items. Our year will end with a Christmas Raffle to be drawn at a Farewell Assembly.

With careful planning and clever shopping, the team were able to make a profit of well over $\$ 1500$. The Square with a screen allows items to be programmed in and receipts to be printed which is perfect for events like the Cinema Night or Twilight Sports BBQs where items can be paid for and orders can be shown on the receipt. This year Kylie and Rachelle created some reimbursement and Invoice Payment forms which are used by all volunteers requiring reimbursements or payments to be made and have made the process smoother for all concerned and has meant that obtaining accurate figures is much easier. Thank you too to Rachelle for taking minutes at P\&F meetings. Thank you, Rachelle, for your patience and commitment to this role.

## Sponsorship and Donations

Much appreciation goes to Jason Barrie and Natalie Lim who took on the role of Sponsorships and Donations Coordinators Thank you for sourcing some great donations for our Masquerade Ball Silent Auction and for sourcing some great raffle prizes throughout the year. Thank you to Jason for liaising with Rebel to use the last of Rebel Community Givebacks Dollars to source some items for our raffles and auctions, some of which have been held over to next year. Unfortunately, this program is still paused with announcements yet to be made if this great community supporter program will continue in a similar or a different form.
This year we also ran another Silent Auction as our Major Fundraiser which ran alongside our major Social Night and was advertised and managed by Kylie Brooks-Verberne.
