The **Bachelor of Health Science** degree equips students with a broad understanding of the themes explored in advanced studies of medicine and offers a potential pathway to the [Doctor of Medicine and Surgery](#) at ANU.

The [Bachelor of Health Science](#) is a distinctive science degree which positions students as a future leader in tackling health problems of national and global significance. It draws upon the world-leading strengths of ANU in *medical education, biomedical science, population health, psychology, social science, and public policy* to prepare students for a future in medical professions.

The Bachelor of Health Science offers a pathway to the postgraduate Doctor of Medicine and Surgery at ANU without having to sit the GAMSAT. Eligible students will receive an offer to the Doctor of Medicine and Surgery, contingent upon their weighted average mark (WAM), an interview process, an application statement and successful completion of the Bachelor of Health Science program.

Deakin's **Bachelor of Business** degree focuses on *emerging and innovative contexts, embedded soft skills and personal development, to prepare you with the skills and experience you need to succeed in the business world*. [Sustainability and Development](#) – this *new* major is built on the broad theme of businesses bracing for a new normal involving harsher and frequent weather uncertainties with unpredictable costs. Students to gain a practical understanding of the interactions between the economy and the environment, and how to propose solutions and approaches that can facilitate a sustainable co-existence of both.

➤ **New Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Information Technology**

This *new* course is tailored for students that are interested in a broad range of areas related to *humanities, social sciences, communication, creative arts, languages, and information technology*. This course is offered at both the Melbourne Burwood and Geelong Waurin Ponds campuses. The VCE entry requirements are: Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 25 in English EAL (English as an additional language) or at least 20 in English other than EAL, and an ATAR is also used as part of the selection criteria.

Aspire – Early Admissions Program to La Trobe

At La Trobe, we believe there is more to being a good student than marks alone.

The [Aspire program](#) rewards the skills and knowledge students gain from the positive impact they have made on their school or community through **community service** or **volunteerism**. Designed to give Year 12's the tools they need to succeed at La Trobe and beyond, students accepted into the Aspire program will get:

- *A taste of university life at La Trobe with special on-campus events before the year commences*
- *The chance to meet and connect with like-minded students*
- *Leadership opportunities, career development, networking, and industry mentoring*
- *VCE revision lectures for Year 12's in the September school holidays*
- *Access to La Trobe's extensive library and campus resources*
- *Induction into La Trobe's Enrichment Program to prepare for what is to come*

Successful applicants also receive their **early conditional offer** in September for their chosen course along with minimum ATAR requirements. Many courses have a minimum ATAR of 55.00, but some professional degree programs have higher requirements.

Up to 40 [Aspire scholarships](#), worth \$5,000 per year for up to four years, will be awarded to leading eligible Aspire students.

The [Minimum ATAR Table](#) shows the minimum ATAR for some professional degree courses for entry through Aspire in 2022. Should an applicant's preferred course not be listed on this table, then the minimum ATAR is 50.00.

Applicants are required to provide information about the length and frequency of their community service and/or volunteering experience, as well as a 400-word description of their involvement and impact.

Types of volunteering include –

- community service or community group activities
- religious/cultural group activities
- participating in social justice groups or a school leadership role
- leadership in sport, the performing arts or charity fund-raising group activities

Scholarship applications should be submitted online; students should note that only one application needs to be made, and students can apply for as many scholarships they are eligible for.

Students are reminded that, for the most part, the only VCE prerequisite subject for university entry is an English. Students should verify this at [VTAC](#). Please note that after completion of an APAC accredited undergraduate degree, a further minimum of three years education and training in psychology are required to register as a psychologist in Australia.

Snapshot of Holmesglen Institute in 2021

- Holmesglen was formed in 1982 and has grown.
- Holmesglen offers over 500 [courses](#) from eight [campuses](#) at six locations, including Chadstone, Moorabbin and Glen Waverley, Bourke Street in the city, St Kilda Road, Futuretech in North Melbourne, and Eildon.
- Holmesglen has invested over \$25 million the last few years in building world-class facilities at the Moorabbin Campus. These include four large teaching wards, microbiology, and bioscience laboratories, two simulation suites, a community apartment, an allied health laboratory, lecture theatres, general teaching spaces, a co-operative learning centre, computer laboratories and teaching and administrative staff offices. The facilities have state-of-the-art equipment, reflective of industry standards.
- In 2017, Healthscope opened Australia's first TAFE-based hospital, the Holmesglen Private Hospital. The [Holmesglen Private Hospital](#) is actually located at the Holmesglen Institute's Moorabbin campus, and provides clinical practice as well as teaching and research for nursing and allied health students.
- The [Learning Skills Centre](#) at Holmesglen is there to help students with their studies. This includes academic referencing, assignment support, note taking, presentation skills, report writing, research skills, study skills, summarising skills, time management.
