- Students who place an eligible Curtin course as their first preference through TISC and receive an ATAR of 96 or above will automatically be considered for the Curtin Excellence Scholarship

- Scholarship offers are made after course offers
- All successful and unsuccessful applications will be notified of the outcome of their application
- Offers will be sent to successful applicants by email along with Terms and Conditions to sign. All scholarship offers are conditional upon successful recipients meeting the scholarship eligibility requirements.
