
Membership nominations are then approved by the TASSA Governing Body.

Welcome to the Alice Springs Steiner School

We hope your stay with us will be richly rewarding for you and your children. Alice Springs is a unique place offering a distinctive environment for children to grow and learn. Our mission is to provide a 'world class' Steiner education for the benefit of the children of Central Australia. Our School was founded in 1997 as a kindergarten by a group of dedicated passionate Alice Springs parents who believed in the Rudolph Steiner philosophy of education. It is now a preschool and primary school, with a new and growing high school of about 200 children altogether. The School and its children are supported by a wonderful community of parents, teachers, staff and friends who all continue to make extraordinary contributions.

From small beginnings behind Araluen, the School moved to the current campus in 2004 where it continues to grow.

Who owns the Alice Springs Steiner School?

The Alice Springs Steiner School is a registered educational establishment owned by **The Alice Springs Steiner Association (TASSA)** formed to:

- Develop and maintain a successful school based on the philosophy of Rudolf Steiner.
- Promote discussion about educational methods and practices arising from Rudolf Steiner's philosophy.
- Engage in and support discussion and activities that flow from the ideas of Rudolf Steiner.

How is TASSA run?

TASSA is run by a Governing Body made up of volunteers who are full members of the Association. The Governing Body's role is to ensure good governance of the School and to manage the employment and performance of the Principal. In turn, the Governing Body delegates responsibility for the day-to-day operation of the School to the Principal.

The Governing Body is also responsible for setting the strategic direction of the school. This is done in conjunction with The Principal and the College of Teachers. The current Strategic Plan runs from Dec 2016 – 2022 and is available from the office.

The educational direction of the School is determined by the Principal, working closely with the College of Teachers. An educational Master Plan is devised every two years through a collaborative process ensuring resources are distributed wisely and the goal of delivering quality educational outcomes for the children is the highest priority.

The School is also supported by non-teaching staff who manage the garden and grounds, the office and the business and finances.

Communication

The School's Communication Policy outlines the communication pathways and protocols within the School between teachers, employees, parents and students.

The health of our school is reflected by our commitment to clear, open and respectful communication at all levels. If you encounter any conflict or have a grievance, please refer to the policy for guidance as to how the school expects this to be managed. A copy of the policy is available from the Office.

The TASSA Governing Body

If you have been a TASSA member for 12 months, you can nominate for membership of the TASSA Governing Body at the Annual General Meeting.

The Sub-Committees are:

- Finance
- Lands and Buildings
- Marketing

Sub-Committees do not have decision making power, being tasked instead to make recommendations to the Governing Body to assist it in making decisions. The TASSA Constitution and the Governing Body Sub- Committee Terms of Reference can be requested from the School Office.
