
However, with a great role comes great responsibility.

Was it hard to adjust to a new school?


Yes and no, I find it hard to adjust to the whole high school life, but everyone is really helpful during transition.

If you had to choose a favourite teacher who would it be?




THE SECRET GARDEN ON 81ST STREET




