MONASH University

With Monash's substantial scholarship programs, students can access a range of services and financial assistance over the course of their degree. Many scholarships offer one-off payments while others continue for the length of the course.

Merit scholarships

Merit scholarships are awarded based on academic achievement and have both financial and academic benefits with up to \$34,000 and guaranteed membership to some of Monash's exclusive mentoring and leadership programs.

There is no application required as it is granted on the ATAR achieved, however students need to have Monash listed as at least one of their preferences in their VTAC form to be considered for a merit scholarship.

Equity scholarships

Equity scholarships are intended for those who identify as Indigenous Australian or Torres Strait Islander, or are currently experiencing financial hardship or disadvantage.

Open: Monday 1 August at 9am Close: Friday 14 October at 5pm

Students must submit an application for equity scholarships through VTAC, along with any necessary supporting documentation. Supporting documentation must also be submitted by Friday 14 October (5pm). Please note that the scholarship application is separate to the SEAS application.

PATHWAYS

Pathways to Education, Science, Business and Nursing

The following pathway courses allow students who may not reach the required ATAR or meet the prerequisites, to gain entry into Monash.

The Diploma of Tertiary Studies (DoTS) and the Diploma of Higher Education (DoHE) are both equivalent to the first year of a university undergraduate degree and allow students to transition to the second year of their destination degree.

Applications can be made through VTAC.

Monash University Supplementary Information form

Students must submit the Monash University Supplementary Information form by 31 December 2016 if they wish to apply for one of the pathway programs. This form is the student's opportunity to outline their motivation to study, career goals and work experience.

➤ **Changes to Maths requirement for Bachelor of Environmental Science**

The mathematics prerequisites for the Bachelor of Environmental Science and the double degrees with Business (Management) and Environment and Society have changed from a VCE Units 3 & 4 study score of at least 20 in "Mathematical Methods" to "a mathematics" (i.e. Further, Methods or Specialist).

➤ **New double degree: Chemical Engineering/Pharmaceutical Sciences**

Gain an end-to-end understanding of how pharmaceutical products are designed and developed, as well as their process involved in the large scale production.

From Semester 1, 2017, RMIT will be offering a 4-year double degree in **Chemical Engineering and Pharmaceutical Sciences**. As the pharmaceutical industry expands in Australia and world-wide, an understanding of the engineering process and other scientific fields involved in drug development and production, will ensure students are well equipped to work across a range of roles. Students will gain a thorough understanding of the principles of chemical engineering and pharmaceutical sciences, allowing them to apply their knowledge to large scale production in the pharmaceutical industry.

Students will need to complete at least 12 weeks of engineering industry experience – allowing them to gain first-hand experience in an engineering environment under the supervision of a professional engineer. There are also opportunities for an overseas work placement of between six and 12 months (this satisfies the work experience requirement). These placements are normally taken during a one-year break in the middle or at the end of the third year of the degree.

Current Year 12 VCE prerequisites are: Units 3 and 4 – a study score of at least 20 in Chemistry and in Mathematical Methods (CAS); and a study score of at least 25 in any English (except EAL) or at least 30 in English (EAL).
