



National Indigenous Summer School 2024

The Tjabal Indigenous Higher Education Centre and ANU Colleges will be hosting a week-long Summer School for Indigenous students currently in years 10 and 11, who are interested in pursuing university studies. The Summer School will take place from November 30th - December 7th, 2024, and is designed to provide hands-on learning experiences that can inform education and career aspirations.

Participants will engage in a range of discipline fields, with a focus on the theme of "The First Academics: The First Scientists, Philosophers, and People". The program will be facilitated by expert academic staff, Indigenous university students, and staff, who will guide students through a fun-filled program in the nation's capital, offering valuable experiences both on and off campus.

All costs for accommodation, transport, catering, and workshop materials will be covered by the Tjabal Centre and ANU Colleges. The Summer School will have two streams, each with 15 places: the Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Medicine (STEMM) stream and the Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences (HASS) stream. Students can select only one stream to attend.

To be eligible for one of the 30 spots in the Summer School, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a current Year 10 or 11 student (Year 12 students will also be considered)
- Identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- Have an interest in Science and Humanities subjects.
