

# **FIRST READING** Baruch 5: 1-9

A reading from the prophet Baruch

Jerusalem – God will show you splendor.

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress,

put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head:

since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven,

since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'.

Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east:

see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them.

Luke 3: 1-6

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *All people shall see the salvation of God.* 

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

Every valley will be filled in,
every mountain and hill be laid low,
winding ways will be straightened
and rough roads made smooth.

On Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> November, five of the MITS year 8-9 students and a staff member, accepted an invitation to dinner in the presbytery with Fr Trung Nguyen SJ, Fr Albino Goncalves SJ, Fr Brian McCoy SJ (who was the Provincial who set this ball rolling) and Licia Marchese (parish manager), together with four parishioners. It proved to be a quite convivial evening. The students, who are usually quite shy and unassuming, took quite an active social part! The food, partly cooked by Fr Trung Nguyen SJ was very well received. The meal was followed by prayer and reflection time in church, plus an advent candle-lighting ceremony and final blessing by Fr McCoy SJ, partly in one of the Arnhem Land languages.
