At St Fidelis, we believe that contemporary learning is underpinned by teaching methods and spaces that are personalized, engaging and motivational. These learning spaces complement current and evolving methods of teaching. The physical environment has been designed for contemporary learning and teaching in the 21st century. All the classrooms have been upgraded to comfortable, inviting areas with adaptable learning spaces, which enables student centered learning and teaching.

In today's interconnected world learning is no longer boxed in four walls. Students today are required to be inquirers, flexible thinkers, self managers, good communicators, collaborators, learn with and from each other, and connect to the global world through the use of technology.

In this environment students engage in teacher and student directed teaching and learning. This includes independent project work, group work and opportunities for innovation, creative thinking and problem solving.

For staff these new learning spaces have freed up their thinking and new way of facilitating instructional teaching and learning. These facilities support our Professional Learning Community, it enables us to collaborate, share best practices, and integrate 21st century skills into classroom practice. The moveable furniture and walls are easily reconfigured for different size groups, explicit teaching and promotes social interactions.

The new Learning spaces including this magnificent outdoor covered area has allowed students and teachers to utilize this outdoor area for various learning experiences such as: Literacy and Numeracy lessons, Mediation sessions, Whole School assemblies or just sitting and building relationships with their friends. This shade cloth has been a most welcomed addition to our school.
