Early Entry Program – 2024 Entry

A different way to enter university that will not depend on your ATAR.

The <u>2024 Early Entry Program | Swinburne</u> is a unique opportunity for current Year 12 students (domestic and onshore International) to receive a <u>conditional offer</u> based on a recommendation by the school, and not based on an ATAR.

Applications are open, and close on 9 October 2023. Successful students will receive a conditional offer and the offer will become unconditional should students complete Year 12 and meet the course prerequisites – particularly English (study score of 25) or EAL (study score of 30).

Details of the application process, as well as participating courses can be found below.

1. Application process

Students must organise a recommendation from a school representative – the school's principal, the year level coordinator, Head of House, or Career Practitioner – in order to proceed with an application.

2. Eligible courses

Courses that will be offered through this program can be found at <u>Eligible Courses</u>, and students can only apply for <u>one course</u>.

Students will be required to complete 3 questions in a *Next Gen Now* questionnaire, and students will be asked to provide a 200-word statement per question.

3. Recommendation form

Once an application is submitted, students will receive a confirmation email which will include the form they need to forward onto their chosen school representative, who will complete the form and return it to Swinburne, who will match it with the student's application.

Students must also make a VTAC application.



News from the University of Tasmania (UTAS)

> <u>New Bachelor of Biomedicine</u>

The University of Tasmania (UTAS) will be offering the *new* Bachelor of Biomedicine from semester 1, 2024. This biomedicine course is designed and will be taught by active medical researchers at the Tasmanian School of Medicine and the School of Health Sciences. It also draws on the expertise of the specialist research and teaching institutes: the Menzies Institute for Medical Research, and the Wicking Dementia Research and Education Centre.

As the single university for Tasmania, students will have unparalleled access and connection to the local community, health system, and institutes. This means that throughout their studies, students are learning from experts who are directly engaged with the health sector both locally, nationally, and internationally.

Chemistry is a prerequisite for entry into this course. This degree <u>may</u> allow further study into medicine.

Bachelor of Pharmacy with Honours – Fast Track

Introducing Australia's only 3-year fast-track Pharmacy degree. The new fast- track Bachelor of Pharmacy with Honours adopts a trimester teaching model, allowing students to complete a traditional 4-year degree in just 3 years and get into the workplace sooner. Placements can be conducted in Tasmania or mainland Australia, as well as internationally. Year 12 maths and chemistry are prerequisites for this course.



REMINDER: University Clinical Aptitude Test

The *University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)* is an admissions test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their <u>medical, dental, and clinical science</u> degree programs. Universities requiring the UCAT are listed at this link - <u>Universities requiring the UCAT</u>. Students intending to apply for courses requiring the UCAT at any of these universities are reminded that they will need to **book a test**.

Bookings close on Wednesday 17 May 2023. The testing dates will be from 3 July 2023 to 12 August 2023.



Principal's Recommendation Scheme at CQU

At CQUniversity we believe senior schooling results are important, but we also believe that other factors such as motivation, talent, and passion can lead to student success at university. So, we have introduced a pilot program, the Principal's Recommendation Scheme, that allows Year 12 students to apply to a CQUniversity course based on the recommendation of their high school Principal rather than ATAR.

So, CQUniversity's Principal's Recommendation Scheme provides an alternate entry pathway to CQUniversity courses that is based on the recommendation of a students' high school Principal and not reliant on whether they have received an ATAR.

Early Offer Scheme

Open to domestic and PR students only

Requirements: Year 12 pass, meet VCE prerequisite study scores, and ATAR required

RMIT's Early Offer Scheme values the entire experience of a student and provides diverse opportunities for students to leverage their acquired skills into their future career and find the right journey to their desired learning outcome.

Australian and Permanent Resident students can apply for <u>one course</u> and must apply at the following RMIT link - <u>Early Offer Scheme</u>. The eligible courses on offer are also found at this link.

The application process requires students to -

- 1. Choose <u>two</u> of the following categories:
- Analytical and Critical Thinking
- Leadership
- Communication
- Creative Thinking and Innovation
- 2. Write a 200-word statement of their experience for each of the two chosen categories.
- 3. Supply supporting documentation verifying their involvement in the two categories they have written about.

Applications are open, and close on the 17 September 2023. Conditional offers will be released by 28 September 2023. The conditional offer will become unconditional should students complete Year 12, meet the course prerequisites, and attain the Early Offer ATAR required. **Students must also make a VTAC application.**

What is a Paralegal?

The <u>Centre for Paralegal Studies</u> states that *paralegals play an integral role in the legal profession, and they can offer significant assistance in the delivery of legal services.*


They work in various types of organisations including law firms, government agencies and corporate legal departments. The use of paralegals in the profession can allow legal services to be delivered more efficiently and more cost effectively.

Although paralegals are not solicitors or barristers, they often perform tasks that are of a legal nature. However, this does not mean that only people who are undertaking a law degree or are

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currently working in a legal environment can obtain a role as a **paralegal**. With the right training, skills and knowledge, opportunities for paralegal roles are available to people from a wide range of disciplines including business and management.

In Victoria, a number of universities offer studies in *Legal Disputes, Criminology, Criminal Justice,* etc. and all lead to careers in the paralegal services.





Fastest growing vs fastest declining Jobs

In the next five years, almost a quarter of jobs (23%) are expected to change through growth of 10.2% and decline of 12.3%, according to the <u>Future of Jobs 2023: These are the fastest-growing jobs</u> <u>World Economic Forum</u>. Employers anticipate **69 million new jobs to be created and 83 million eliminated** - a net decrease of 14 million jobs, or 2% of current employment.

Human Resources Courses in Victoria in 2023

The Good Universities Guide* states that Human Resources Officers provide administration services for the recruitment and employment of staff. In small organisations, Human Resources Officers are usually responsible for all staffing matters. In large organisations they may specialise in a particular area such as recruitment, wages and entitlements or staff training.

Personal requirements of a Human Resources Officer -

- Good planning, organisational, analytical and decision-making skills
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Tactful and discrete when dealing with people and confidential information
