## RATIONALE

Modbury School P-6 is proud of the School Uniform. Students attending Modbury School P-6 are expected to wear school uniform and we encourage all families to support our students at Modbury School P-6 to wear their uniform with pride. Wearing of the school uniform promotes:

- Development of the school identity allowing students to gain a sense of being part of the School Community
- Identifying students when they are out of school on excursion
- School uniform means that there is no competition between students regarding clothing and brands
- The uniform fosters positive school culture and promotes unity
- Ensures the health and safety of students

**We are a registered Sun Smart school with the Cancer Council SA.**

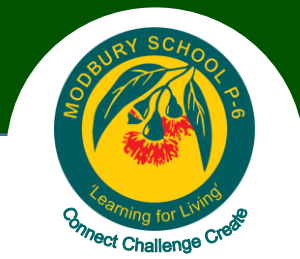
**The School Uniform approved by the Governing Council is:**

1. Modbury School P-6 Polo Top
2. Bottle green or gold Polo top
3. Modbury School P-6 Jumper with Logo
4. Bottle green Jumper
5. Bottle green zip-up jacket
6. Black or bottle green mid-thigh shorts or full-length pants (excludes bike shorts) with no brand names
7. Black or bottle green mid-thigh skorts, skirts or 3/4 pants with no brand names
8. Summer dress in green and white check
9. Black, bottle green, gold or white Skivvy (to be worn under polo)
10. Approved Modbury sun-smart Hat in bottle green – all year round
11. Approved sun-smart hat in bottle green – all year round
12. Modbury School P-6 Brand Beanie – Term 2 only

## SHOES

Students should wear appropriate enclosed shoes for physical activity.





## YEAR 6 STUDENTS

The Year 6 polo shirt and jacket have the names of all the Year 6 students. This design is decided each year by students.

## HATS

All students are to wear approved hats all year at Modbury School P-6. The hats must be broad-brimmed, bucket or legionnaires with no cords or toggles. Students who do not have hats will be required to play under the allocated shade areas. Beanies can be worn in Terms 2. It is expected that hats and beanies are not worn inside. Religious headdress is permitted. As some headdress makes it uncomfortable to wear sun-safe hats, permission to not wear a hat for this reason is negotiated with Leadership.

## SPORTS CARNIVALS

Students are expected to wear the sport's uniform supplied by the school at all interschool sport's carnivals. Students are expected to wear a hat all year round.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Hair longer than the shoulders needs to be tied back and away from the face.
- The school uniform does not include denim jeans, denim shorts or board shorts.
- Pants/shorts with stripes or pants/shorts with visible logos are not permitted.
- Jewellery should be minimal and inconspicuous. Simple stud or small sleeper earrings, a watch (not a smart watch), a necklace (of significant meaning – to be worn under clothes and out of sight), a bracelet and no more than 1 ring. Facial jewellery is not to be worn to school unless for cultural reasons.
- Casual day attire must be sun-safe.
- When students are dressed in their school uniform, we expect their behaviour and attitude to reflect our school values. This also applies when students are on the way to and from school, and also out in public in their school uniform.

Parents of students consistently not wearing the correct school uniform will be reminded by the class teacher and in ongoing cases will be contacted by Leadership.
