Big change coming! From mid December, under 16s won't be able to have accounts on some social media platforms.

DIGITAL WELLNESS TIPS





Avoid doomscrolling before bed - it disrupts your sleep cycle. Podcasts, journaling, and reading are good alternatives!



Use Do Not Disturb or Focus Mode when you need to concentrate.

IN FOCUS: SEXTORTION



WHAT IS IT?

Sextortion is a form of blackmail where someone threatens to share a nude or sexual image or video of you unless you give in to their demands.



Tell someone you trust and report it straight away. Under 18s can report to ACCCE, 18+ can report it to the platform. If the image or video is shared report it to eSafety.

THINGS TO THINK ABOUT

- **Blackmailers** can be anyone (strangers or peers) so be mindful of who you meet and talk to online. They can hide behind fake profiles.
- * Stop all contact and do not pay the blackmailer or give them more money or intimate content.
- **Keep the receipts** take screenshots, photos or screen recordings of messages and profiles so you have evidence to report.
- * It's never your fault. You're not alone and help is always there.

DID YOU KNOW?



- Cyberbullying reports to eSafety have increased by 450% in the last 5 years.
- 1 in 3 young women and 1 in 5 young men have experienced online sexual harassment.
- Australia's eSafety Commissioner is a world-first government regulator focused solely on online safety.
