What Is The Essendon Football Club?

The Essendon Football Club is a team in the Australian Football League (AFL) who were established in 1872. They began as a Victorian Football League team (VFL), but have since moved to the AFL. They currently have the fourth biggest fan base across the league. Essendons home ground is the Melbourne Cricket Ground and Marvel stadium, their training ground is at Windy Hill and the Hanger in the north-west Melbourne suburbs. Tied with Collingwood Magpies and Carlton Blues, Essendon have the greatest number of premiership wins of sixteen.

Even though Essendon haven't won a premiership in twenty five years and haven't won a final in seven thousand six hundred and sixty five days and counting, they're still an excellent football side.

The History Of Essendon Football Club

In the beginning of the Essendon Football Club they were based in Essendon, Melbourne, Victoria. They started playing in the VFL, before the AFL came into existence. They had a good start to their career, making it to the first grand final in 1898, losing to Fiztroy by 15 points. They are the only team to win all but one game in a season, in 2000. It was the most dominant season by a club ever.

In 2013, Essendon had a drug scandal. 34 Senior listed players were suspended, including James Hird who was an ex-Essendon player and the senior coach at the time. Jobe Watson, won the brownlow winner for 2012, was then stripped of his medal following the scandal. Essendon were also kicked out of the AFL finals in 2013. They lost a great number of players, due to suspension, retiring or wanting to leave the club. This meant they had to find many new players, to fill the team.

Brownlow Medalist

The Brownlow is a medal given to the best player on field, as decided by the umpires. Every game the umpires vote for who they believe was the best player on field. Who they believe played the best gets three votes. The player who gets second best on field gets two votes, and third best on field gets one vote. Whoever has the most votes at the end of the season wins the brownlow. The players that have won the Brownlow medal playing for Essendon include:

- Dick Reynolds x3 1934,1937,1938
- Bill Hutchison x2 1953,1952
- James Hird 1996, Gavin Wangang 1993, and Graham Moss 1976 1
- Jobe Watson won in 2012, but was later stripped of the medal due to his involvement with performance-enhancing drugs.
