BE AT THE FOREFRONT OF MANAGING CHANGE!

Enrol in the International Diploma Course in Resilient Health Care Management. The purpose of this course is to teach how Resilient Health Care can be applied to the management of health care systems as support to Resilient Health Care in practical clinical work.

The course is provided by the School of Health and Welfare at Jönköping University in Sweden in collaboration with the International Society for Quality in Healthcare (ISQua) and supported by the Australian Institute of Health Innovation at Macquarie University, Sydney, Australia. The lead faculty are Jeffrey Braithwaite, Erik Hollnagel, and Axel Ros.

The course is blended multimodal learning with residential sessions, webinars and self-directed and reflective learning. The teaching is conducted through English.

Professionals in health care with managerial responsibilities, either corporate or clinical, are invited to enrol. This includes department and clinical team leads, risk managers, medical directors, quality managers, organizational developers, patient advocates, etc.

PROGRAM DESIGN

The course is blended multimodal learning with residential sessions, webinars and self-directed and reflective learning.

Module 1: 9 - 13 March 2020 (5 days) Residential Session in Dublin, Ireland

Modules 2-5: March – September 2020 Distance learning with online web lectures and seminars, peer to peer learning and course work.

All modules require the study of selected relevant literature

Module 6: 21 - 25 September 2020 (5 days) Residential Session in Jönköping, Sweden

Please note that booking and payment of the travel and accommodation to Dublin and Jönköping is the responsibility of the student.

COURSE FEE

The course is run as commissioned education, meaning it is intended for employers who wish to send their employees for further education. As a commissioned education the application process is managed by Jönköping University.

The cost for the course is €10,900 Euro (including entry into ISQua's Fellowship Programme). Costs for literature, travel and hotels are not included. If starting in Cape Town, the ISQua Conference fee is not included.

If you are self-funding, the application will be managed by ISQua and an additional €100 Euro administration fee will apply.

Successful completion of the course will earn 30 ECTS credits. Students who successfully complete the course and the thesis can apply for a course certificate.

Students will also be registered on ISQua's Fellowship Programme at sign-up. Upon attainment of the ISQua Fellowship, Fellows have the option to continue learning by renewing their Fellowship annually.
