What are we learning in Term Three?

English This term, Year Two students will engage in rich Literacy tasks. They will focus on Information reports as well as Narrative performances by exploring their

In Reading, students will build on their prior knowledge to develop a deeper understanding of texts as well as to make predictions. They will also practice answering questions by looking for and using information.

structure and identifying their purpose.

They will also build on their Reading fluency by practicing their expression of different punctuation through their Narrative Performances.

In Writing, students will explore the writing process by creating their own Information Reports and Narrative Performances.

In Speaking and Listening, students will participate in daily reflections, focusing on sharing their learning.

This term, Year Two students will participate in a range of activities to develop their ability to

identify, classify and compare shapes based on their features. They will grow their understanding of the language used to describe shapes such as sides, corners, parallel, curved, opposite and straight.

Mathematics

They will also build their understanding of recognising that fractions are an equal part of a whole and can be broken into equal parts and groups. They will be applying this knowledge into real-life contexts by breaking collections into fractions.

The students will also use a broad range of activities to focus on developing their ability to measure and compare objects based on their length, capacity and mass using appropriate uniform informal units of measurement.



Inquiry

This term, Year two students will participate in a range of hands-on activities that will allow them to explore sources of light, create shadows and experiment with sounds.

They will develop their understanding of light and sound through designing and using technology.

Throughout the term the students will work towards presenting a production of a story using puppets to manipulate shadows and create sounds.

They will also be given the opportunity to create instruments using different materials and explore the sounds that they can make.

Weeks	Topic	What you can do at home to assist your child's learning	
1-5	Information Reports— Questioning and Synthesising	Ask your child to write facts about a topic of interest. This could include an animal, sport, pop star etc. Ask your child questions about the book and allow them to explain their new understanding of the text after reading it.	
6-10	Narrative Perfor- mance— Fluency and Predictions	Ask your child to practice writing their own play and allow them to create their own shadow puppets at home using their hands and a torch.
