Tuckwell Scholarship for 2026

The Tuckwell Scholarship Program at the ANU is the most transformational undergraduate scholarship program in Australia. A Tuckwell is not just about a students' intellect. It is also about their desire and determination to use their natural abilities to realise their full potential so that they can make a difference in the world. Up to 25 talented and motivated students from across the country are awarded a Tuckwell, giving them with the opportunity to realise their potential by providing them with financial support, personal enrichment, and development opportunities. All up one could say, this is no ordinary scholarship!

All eligible applicants are considered against four criteria:

- 1. Academic potential and achievements;
- 2. Other significant achievements of any type;
- 3. Demonstration of the Tuckwell Attributes; and
- 4. Connection and commitment to Australia.

Tuckwell Scholar students receive:

- \$26,000 per annum (2024 rate) (increasing annually) for the length of your undergraduate degree program (studying full-time), to cover on-campus residential costs, books and general living expenses.
- a one-off payment of \$1,500 relocation grant for first year Scholars.
- guaranteed access to ANU-approved student accommodation.
- travel allowances to assist with your move to Canberra and to support two annual return journeys (e.g. airfares) between your home and the University for each year of your degree.
- an allowance to help cover the transport costs for your parents to attend Commencement Weekend at the start of the program, and
- an ANU Sports Centre membership.

Applications will open in <u>early March 2025</u>, and close on <u>14 April 2025</u>. Until applications open, interested students are encouraged to read the <u>Tuckwell 2026 Application Guide</u>, to familiarise themselves with the application process, and discuss their interest, suitability and eligibility for the Scholarship with a teacher or the Careers Practitioner.

University Clinical Aptitude Test

The *University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)* is an admissions test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their <u>medical, dental, and clinical science</u> degree programs. Universities requiring the UCAT are listed at this link - <u>Universities requiring the UCAT</u> but also listed below.

Students intending to apply for courses requiring the UCAT at any of these universities are reminded that they will need to **book a test**.

<u>NOTE</u>: The UCAT ANZ test is changing in 2025. The Abstract Reasoning subtest will be withdrawn from the test. The *new* test format will comprise 3 cognitive subtests: Verbal Reasoning, Decision Making, Quantitative Reasoning, <u>and</u> the Situational Judgement Test. The *new* practice tests relevant to the abovementioned change, will be launched in early March 2025.

Students who are preparing for entry into any of these courses are encouraged to familiarise themselves with the **format of the test at <u>UCAT Test Format</u>** and the **practice tests and preparation material** provided at **UCAT Preparation** when available.

Bookings will open on 4 March 2025 and close 16 May 2025. The testing dates will be from 1 July 2025 to 5 August 2025.

Maria Island Marine Biology Experience

The University of Tasmania is once again proud to present Year 11 and 12 students with a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience a week as a marine biologist.

<u>A Practical Introduction to Temperate Marine Biology</u> is an introduction to the <u>Bachelor of Marine and Antarctic Science</u> degree at UTAS. Upon completing this short course, students will receive a credit unit towards their future <u>University of Tasmania</u> degree.

This is a 5-day field trip based on the picturesque Maria Island, on the Tasmanian East Coast. The unit is open to 24 students and is designed to engage, challenge, excite and inspire students through a hands-on marine science program. It will encourage them to explore issues threatening biodiversity as well as the productivity of the marine system. Climate change, invasive species, pollution, debris and their associated social and economic impacts will all be covered.

Career as a Biomedical Engineer

The Good Universities Guide* states that *Biomedical Engineers apply engineering and scientific methods to find solutions to problems in medicine and the life sciences.*

Biomedical Engineers fulfil a number of tasks including -

- Designing new medical monitoring, diagnostic and therapeutic equipment
- Setting up and maintaining medical equipment
- Plan data processing services and the development of associated computing programs
- Analyse new medical procedures to forecast likely outcomes
- Participate in medical or scientific procedures where biomedical skills are needed
- Design and deliver technology to assist people with disability
- Analyse and design prosthetic and orthotic devices

* Biomedical Engineer

To become a Biomedical Engineer, students you usually have to complete an engineering degree at university with a major in biomedical engineering. Several universities in Victoria offer Biomedical Engineering as a specialisation. Students are encouraged to browse <u>VTAC</u> to learn about these courses and their entry requirements.



Most universities in Victoria offer an Arts degree, and many of these are listed below. Students should note that the prerequisite VCE subject for most Arts degrees is only an English or EAL. We would like to share with you a unique science workshop series designed especially for female secondary school students to further their understanding of science and knowledge of cetaceans (whales and dolphins).


Workshop Series Details:
