The long-term structural shift in employment growth towards services-related industries is projected to continue over the next 5 and 10 years. [Figure 1]

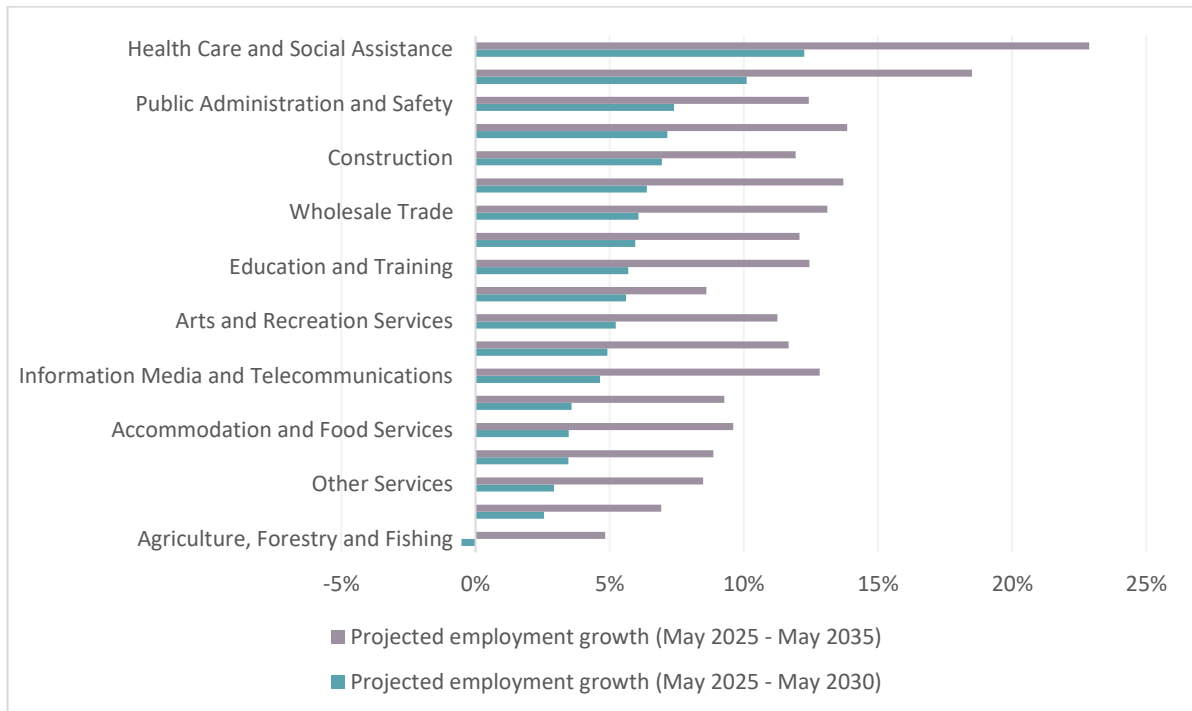

The table above [Figure 2] provides Industry - Employment Projections nationally, and a couple of factors are worth focusing on:

- Health Care and Social Assistance continues to be the largest employing industry
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services is predicted to be the second-largest employing industry

With this in mind, it is important to note that, in recent years, most employment growth has been seen in jobs that typically require **post-secondary qualifications**. The 2025 projections suggest that this trend will continue, with more than **90% of the employment growth over the next 10 years in these occupations (skill levels 1 to 4)**.

Skill Level 1	Bachelor's degree or higher qualification
Skill Level 2	Advanced diploma or diploma
Skill Level 3	Certificate IV or III (including at least 2 years' on-the-job training)
Skill Level 4	Certificate II or III
Skill Level 5	Certificate I or secondary education
