Numeracy and Literacy

In numeracy, the students are continuing to learn about subtraction. They have been using mental strategies to solve a range of subtraction stories. Throughout this unit of inquiry, the students will also be exploring measurement, looking at comparing the length, mass, and capacity of different objects. The year ones will also be exploring fractions of a whole and of a collection.

During this term, Grade 1 students will continue to develop their writing skills, learning to write procedures. We will also continue our fortnightly Big Writes.

Next term, we will begin sending home SMART spelling words

When reading, the children are consolidating their skills to solve unknown words and developing their comprehension of stories. At home, you can support their learning by asking questions about the book
