About

The ultimate challenge of the Edmund Rice Readers' Cup is to read 13 novels in total. Participants begin this challenge by reading 10 novels: 5 from the Reading List and 5 of their own choosing to gain a *Certificate of Achievement* and 10 House Points.

Students have the opportunity to gain more House points by reading further from the choices in the following higher Merit Awards:

- Thomas Keneally [Bronze]: 5 points
- C.J Dennis [Silver]: 5 points
- Francis Webb [Gold]: 5 points

These awards are named after three great Australian writers & poets: graduates of Edmund Rice schools. The poet, Francis Webb is an old boy of St Pius X College.

Each time a student finishes reading a novel they are required to fill in the log sheet and have it signed by their English teacher. When the participant has met the criteria for a Certificate of Achievement or higher merit award, the recording sheet should be handed to your English teacher.

Merit Awards

Thomas Keneally [Bronze] Readers' Cup Award
Certificate of Achievement & ONE novel from the Bronze level.

C.J. Dennis [Silver] Readers' Cup Award
Students must have met the criteria for the Bronze level and ONE novel from the silver level.

Francis Webb [Gold] Readers' Cup Award
Students must have met the criteria for the Bronze and Silver level before reading ONE novel from the Gold level.
