Naplan 2025	The upcoming National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assessments for our

	NAPLAN is designed to assess the literacy and numeracy skills of Australian students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. Its purpose is to:
	<ul> <li>Measure student progress – It provides a snapshot of each child's abilities in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar, punctuation), and numeracy.</li> <li>Support teaching and learning – Schools and teachers use the results to identify strengths and areas for improvement, helping to tailor learning programs.</li> <li>Provide national data – NAPLAN helps governments and education authorities track trends in student achievement over time and ensure all students receive the support they need.</li> <li>While NAPLAN is a useful tool, it is just one measure of student learning, and results should be considered alongside ongoing classroom assessments.</li> </ul>
	We wish our Year 3 and 5 students all the very best as they engage in NAPLAN over the coming few weeks.
