1. Respectful Communication

3. Safety and Wellbeing

- Follow all school policies, including parking, pick-up/drop-off procedures, and uniform requirements.
- Avoid entering classrooms or school grounds without signing in at the office.
- Ensure that interactions with children other than your own are appropriate and supportive.

4. Digital Conduct

- Use social media responsibly by refraining from sharing inappropriate comments, images, or posts about the school or its community.
- Raise concerns directly with the school instead of voicing them online.

5. Conflict Resolution

- Approach conflicts calmly and respectfully, focusing on solutions.
- Avoid public criticism or confrontations, particularly in front of children.

6. Inclusion and Diversity

- Celebrate the diversity of our school community by being inclusive and welcoming to all families.
- Avoid behaviour or language that discriminates, excludes, or offends others.

Consequences for Breaching the Code

Failure to follow this Code of Conduct may result in:

- A warning or discussion with school leadership.
- Restricted access to school events or grounds.
- Referral to relevant authorities in cases of serious breaches.
