Dear Families,

Ocean Grove Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of the voluntary financial contributions and student stationery contributions for 2025.

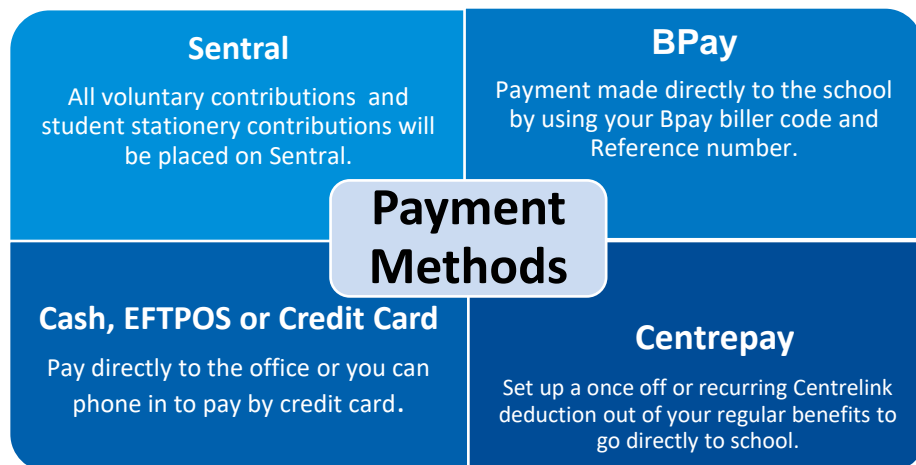
This year we trialled the bulk purchase of student supplies delivered straight to the classroom. This was a success and we received positive feedback from staff and parents.

We will be purchasing bulk supplies again for each year level. A student stationery contribution, as well as other voluntary financial contributions will be placed on Sentral in Term 1. After feedback from our school community we have combined the Curriculum Contributions into one amount applicable for the different year levels (see page 2). You can choose to pay these in full, part pay or pay instalments which is similar to how you would pay for optional excursions or camps on Sentral. Any shortfall from stationery contributions not being met may affect funds being allocated to other programs beneficial to students.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum, however the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that is through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Ocean Grove Primary School is a **non-profit organisation**. The Department of Education provides funds through the Student Resource Package to operate and staff the school, and your fundraising and voluntary financial contributions enable us to enhance the teaching and learning programs.

We thank you for your financial contribution to the school so we can continue to add value to your child's education, particularly in areas such as STEM, Art, Music, Languages and extra curricular programs to enhance learning.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Ocean Grove Primary School offers a range of items and activities that enhance and broaden the schooling experience of students and that are above what the school provides in order to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis. This includes excursions, swimming, sport, camps and in-school special events. These will be payable through Sentral. School photos are ordered and paid for directly to the company.

Financial Support for Families

Ocean Grove Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (available for families who hold a health care or pensioner card \$150 per year per student), forms are available from the office
- School Saving Bonus \$400 for each student for camps, sport, swimming, activities and uniforms
- State Schools Relief – assistance for uniform
- Parent Payment plans including cash, credit Centrepay or BPay. Families can set up regular direct debit or BPay transfers

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
