Get career ready at high school with TAFE at School. If you're in Year 10, 11 or 12 you may be able to complete a TAFE Queensland qualification while you're still at school. What is a School-Based Apprenticeship?

School-based apprentices and trainees are trained in their chosen apprenticeship or traineeship, in the workplace and through a training organization, while continuing to study towards their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) at school. To commence a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship (SAT), a student must have the support of the employer, the school, a supervising registered training organisation and their parent/guardian. Queensland Police First Nations Recruit Preparation Pathway (FNRPP)

The Queensland Police Service (QPS) offers positions for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in its First Nations Recruit Preparation Pathway (FNRPP). For successful participants, the FNRPP provides direct entry into the recruit training program. Participants for the FNRPP are selected by QPS Recruiting during the recruiting process in consultation with the applicant. Potential applicants also may be referred to the program via our First Nations Recruitment Team. Individuals who wish to be considered for entry to the FNRPP can do so by completing the standard requirements.

To be eligible for appointment to the QPS as an IRPP participant, you must successfully satisfy the requirements of all three stages of the IRPP selection process:

Stage 1 - minimum application requirements

Stage 2 - applicant assessments

Stage 3 - selection

QTAC & Tertiary Entry



How are applicants selected for courses through QTAC?

Many QTAC courses are competitive, so meeting the entry requirements doesn't always guarantee you a place. To be considered, you usually need to:

- meet the course entry requirements (such as prerequisite subjects, a portfolio, interview, audition, test or other requirements) and
- be selected on merit using your ATAR or QTAC Selection Rank.

Applicants who meet the requirements are ranked by their ATAR or Selection Rank. The Lowest Selection Rank (LSR) is the rank of the last person offered a place in a course in the previous intake. LSRs can change every year depending on demand, so previous years' LSRs are only a guide.

Opening of QTAC Admission 2027

Year 12 students can start their 2027 QTAC application from 4 August by registering to get their ATAR calculated and applying through the QTAC Application Portal for courses in 2027. Use your personal email address, not your school email! Key things to know:

- QTAC applications cost \$75 before 30 September 2026, or \$159 from 1 October 2026.
- Your application isn't submitted until it's paid.
- You can pay by Mastercard, Visa, direct debit or EFTPOS (debit card).
- If you're paying by debit card, pay by 25 September to allow time for the payment to clear.
- If you're having trouble paying or can only pay with cash, speak to your guidance officer or school counsellor.
- Save or print your payment receipt as proof of payment.

Q&A's from QTAC

Q - What does early bird application mean?

A. - Apply to QTAC on or before 30 September 2026 and pay the Early Bird application fee of \$75. After 30 September 2026 an application will cost \$159.

Q - How do I apply to university for next year?

A. - Apply through [QTAC](#) for most Queensland tertiary courses. Applications to interstate tertiary institutions are through their tertiary admissions centres (similar to QTAC). Apply directly to institutions not appearing in QTAC.

Q. - What is QTAC?

A. - The [Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre](#) (QTAC) is a public, not-for-profit company that manages applications and offers for Queensland universities, TAFE Queensland and some private colleges in Queensland (three interstate institutions are also included). The institutions make the rules and QTAC administers them.

Q. - How many courses can I apply for through QTAC?

A. - You can apply for a total of 6 courses from any of the institutions that use QTAC. **You receive only one offer** if you meet the prerequisites and have a competitive ATAR or rank. [Find out more here](#) (scroll right down the page!).

Q. - How are applicants selected for courses through QTAC?

A. - You have to meet minimum entry requirements (prerequisite subjects, folio, audition, etc.) and be competitive on merit (ATAR or Selection Rank). Once minimum entry requirements are met, applicants compete on the basis of merit for competitive courses.

Q.-What is the difference between undergraduate and postgraduate courses?

A. - The term 'undergraduate' applies to diploma, advanced diploma, associate degree and bachelor degree courses. 'Postgraduate' applies to courses you study after completing a bachelor degree, e.g. graduate certificate, graduate diploma, masters and doctorate.

Q. - What does it mean if a degree indicates (Honours)

A. - Honours means that the degree will take 4 years to complete. The degree requires an additional year of full-time study attached to a bachelor degree to allow for greater understanding and specialisation.

Q. - What does core unit mean?

A. - A subject you must complete as part of your degree.

The difference between QCE and ATAR

The QCE and ATAR are different and have different purposes.

- QCE (Queensland Certificate of Education): Shows what you've learned and the results you achieved in your senior subjects. Employers and training providers may look at your QCE.
- ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank): Ranks you against other Year 12 students and is mainly used by universities to select applicants.

My QCE Student Portal registration

If you're in Year 12, the myQCE Student Portal is where you can access your subjects, results, VET qualifications, Queensland Certificate of Education and other learning records. You can also check your personal details. Register before you leave school to avoid the end-of-year rush. You'll need:

- your LUI number (available from your school).
