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

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# Letter to Year 6 Students and Parents/Carers inviting application for the 2024-25 Northern Bay College Year 7&8 Scholarship

Dear Parent / Carer and Year 6 student

I would like to invite students to apply for a Northern Bay College Scholarship in one of four areas of excellence:

- Academic includes all core curriculum of English, Maths, Languages Other than English, Humanities, as well as other learning experiences (<u>LINK</u> to online application)
- **Sport, Physical Education and Health,** includes interschool and community sport, PE and health areas (LINK to online application)
- Sciences and Technologies including Science, STEM, digital technologies and Technologies such as Wood, Food, Materials and Textiles, Robotics, Mechanical, etc. (LINK to online application)
- **The Arts** including Music, Dance, Dramatic Arts, Visual Arts, Media, Graphics, etc (<u>LINK</u> to online application)

Students can apply for <u>one or more</u> of these areas.

#### Step 1...Written Application:

The application is an easy-to-use online form that aims to allow the student to write a mini "resume" describing their achievements, skill levels and their aspirations.

The LINK to each of the FOUR scholarship areas are provided above.

Parents are encouraged to support the application, but the application should be the student's own work.

The Scholarship Panel will use the Written application, School reports and Endorsements to shortlist students who will be asked to progress to the next step. This model will mirror real life application processes.

Students not identified to progress through to the next step will be notified by letter.

#### Step 2...Interview with the Scholarship Panel:

Students shortlisted after the Written Application, will be invited to attend an interview which will take up to twenty minutes.

Each shortlisted student will be provided with a letter explaining when and where the interview will be held. The letter will also outline what to bring to the interview.

#### Step 3...Being selected as scholarship recipient

Following the interview, the Scholarship Panel will determine the successful students for each Scholarship Area.

All applicants, successful and unsuccessful, will be notified by letter of the outcome of their scholarship application.

Where a student may have applied for more than one scholarship area, they will be notified of the outcome and asked to select their preferred area.

#### Step 4...Attending a celebration Morning Tea to be presented with your Scholarship

Students chosen to be a 2024-25 NBC Year 7&8 Scholarship recipient will be invited to join parents/carers and staff at a Morning Tea to celebrate the presentation of their scholarship and meet the other members of this special group



The Year 7&8 Scholarships provide a range of supports for each area of scholarship as the students enters Year 7 and progresses to the Goldsworthy Years 9-12 Campus, guiding each student as they work towards completing Year 12 and preparing for life beyond secondary school.

The 2024-25 Year 7&8 Scholarship provides benefits at the College to the value of approximately \$4,000.

- Successful students, with support of a parent/carer, will meet with College representatives to identify the areas of support that would assist them the most
- The support aims to provide access to opportunities and resources listed under each of the four scholarship areas and will include:
  - o a \$250 Uniform voucher per year for Years 7 and 8.
  - o up to \$1000 per year towards membership, competition fees and related equipment for Years 7&8
  - access to related school programs, visits, opportunities and materials up to the value of \$1500 across the two years of Years 7&8 to enhance potential.

Each awardee will have an annual review prior to the following school year to reset goals and expectations. However, the award can be withdrawn at any time if the student does not maintain the high expectations in attendance, behaviour and character qualities in line with our College values.

Once again, we encourage you to support your child to consider making an application for a scholarship for 2024 - 2025

# 2024-25 Year 7&8 Scholarship Agreement

#### The Scholarship expectations for the student, their family and the college:

The college, your family and you, are very much aware that scholarships are a competitive process and with it comes high levels of expectations over the two-year period which commences in Year 7 2024, through transition to Goldsworthy Years 9-12 campus to undertake Year 9.

#### **Student Expectations and Agreement:**

- **Attendance**...A commitment to a minimum 90% attendance, to take advantage of this opportunity and endeavour to seek and achieve personal learning goals.
- **Behaviour...**To understand that you are in a position to model to other students that scholarships are a result of having a positive attitude, behaviours and have pride in our college, in yourself and in your uniform.
- **Character qualities**...To model the College values and to raise issues impacting on your learning and well-being at school with your family, teacher or myself.

#### Family Expectations and Agreement:

- An ongoing commitment to support your child's learning and developmental growth by providing emotional and environment supports that allows for home study and a healthy lifestyle.
- A commitment to ensure your child can wear school uniform daily and be a model for successful commitment to learning and the college with a 90% attendance profile.
- A commitment to engage with college staff should issues arise concerning your child's progress, wellbeing and transition through to Year 9 at the Goldsworthy Campus.
- If circumstances change and your family must leave Northern Bay College, to make every effort to return the complimentary resources and uniform no longer required to the Campus office.

#### **College Expectations**


