10 free skills that will boost your career confidence

Imagine you're scrolling through job ads and spot the perfect role - the pay looks great, the work sounds exciting, and it matches your <u>Cluster</u>...but then you see this requirement: "typing 45 words per minute with 95% accuracy." Your heart sinks as you realise your typing skills probably sit around 30 words per minute on a good day. Thankfully, this skill (along with many others) can be learned for free right now. And they're not just valuable for work - you'll use them in daily life too, whether you're writing assignments, managing your finances, or simply becoming a more capable human being.

Typing and keyboard skills

Why it matters: So many of us work on computers now that fast, accurate typing has evolved from a specialist skill to a workplace essential. It can help you breeze through emails and reports, finish assignments faster, and communicate more efficiently online.

How to build it:

- Use platforms like TypingClub or Keybr for 15 minutes a day
- Transcribe your favourite song lyrics or podcast episodes
- Copy paragraphs from books or news articles
- Practice touch typing without looking at the keyboard
- Type out handwritten notes to digitise them

Time management and organisation

Why it matters: Employers love people who can juggle multiple tasks without dropping the ball. This skill separates the good employees from the great ones, and you can start practising it with your schoolwork right now.

How to build it:

- Use free apps like Google Calendar or Todoist to plan your week
- Explore techniques like the <u>Pomodoro Technique</u>
- Track how long tasks actually take versus your estimates
- Volunteer to coordinate school events or group projects
- Try apps like <u>Stay Focused</u> or <u>PawBlock</u> to minimise distractions

Basic financial literacy

Why it matters: Understanding budgets, percentages, and <u>basic financial concepts</u> will serve you well in almost any job, from retail to engineering. Plus, you'll make better personal financial decisions throughout your life.

How to build it:

- Create a personal budget using a spreadsheet
- Calculate discounts while shopping
- Help your family compare prices at the supermarket
- Compare phone plans or streaming services to see which is the best value
- Take free online courses (like <u>this one</u> from Khan Academy)

Professional communication

Why it matters: Knowing how to <u>write clear, professional emails</u> might sound simple, but you'd be surprised how many people struggle with this. Clear, respectful communication builds trust, helps resolve conflict, and allows you to share ideas effectively.

How to build it:





- Email teachers with specific, polite questions about assignments
- Write thank-you notes after work experience placements
- Practice active listening during family discussions
- Join debate clubs or public speaking groups
- Proofread friends' university applications or resumes

Basic computer troubleshooting

Why it matters: When the printer jams or the computer freezes, being the person who can calmly fix it makes you incredibly valuable. Knowing how to keep your own devices running well saves time and stress (and if you're working remotely, you're going to need a few basic skills).

How to build it:

- Search error messages before asking for help
- Learn keyboard shortcuts for common programs
- Watch tech repair videos on YouTube
- Offer to set up devices for family or friends
- Regularly back up files and organise folders

Customer service mindset

Why it matters: Whether dealing with customers or colleagues, knowing how to handle difficult situations with patience and kindness is key. It means listening carefully, having a positive attitude, and treating everyone with respect.

How to build it:

- Volunteer at community events where you'll meet diverse people
- Work part-time in retail or hospitality
- Practice staying calm during disagreements
- Read a wide variety of different perspectives and opinions
- Mentor younger students in subjects you excel at

Attention to detail

Why it matters: Many jobs need people who can enter information correctly, share details clearly, and remember important facts. Good attention to detail can help you spot errors and avoid costly mistakes.

How to build it:

- Volunteer to update contact lists for sports teams or clubs
- Transcribe handwritten notes into digital formats
- Proofread your assignments carefully before submitting
- Create detailed study notes from textbooks
- Explore online data entry courses through providers like Coursera

Basic design and presentation skills

Why it matters: Even if you're not pursuing a creative career, you'll probably still need to know how to create clear, professional-looking documents and presentations. This includes understanding layout principles, using appropriate fonts, and creating visual hierarchy.

How to build it:

- Use <u>Canva</u> to start learning the basics
- Create infographics for class presentations
- Make social media graphics for events or causes you support
- Learn basic photo editing with GIMP or Photopea
- Study good design examples in magazines and websites

Research and information evaluation

Why it matters: Whether it's for a school project or solving a problem at work, knowing how to find reliable and accurate information is a valuable skill. You'll make better decisions based on solid evidence and avoid misinformation and scams.





How to build it:

- Fact-check news stories using multiple sources
- Use reputable journals for academic research projects
- Practice summarising complex articles in simple terms
- Learn to identify bias in different media sources
- Use free resources like <u>Google Fact Check Tools</u>

Basic project management

Clear, error-free writing shows employers you can communicate complex ideas effectively and pay attention to detail. This skill will serve you whether you're writing reports, communications, procedures, official paperwork, or even social media content for work.

How to build it:

- Use free tools like <u>Trello</u> to plan group assignments
- Break large goals into smaller, more manageable steps
- Try to estimate realistic timelines for different types of tasks
- Practice delegating responsibilities in team situations
- Help with planning the next family holiday

Small efforts add up over time

One of the best things about these skills is that they all build on each other. Strong typing skills can make your communication more efficient; good organisation helps with research projects; attention to detail can improve your customer service skills.

Start with one or two skills that interest you most, and set aside as little as 15 minutes a day to practice. By the time you finish school, you'll have a solid set of skills you can use in both work and everyday life. You can find more career guidance and skill-building resources on our website here.

How much homework should you be doing at high school?

Are you spending hours hunched over textbooks wondering if you're doing too much or too little homework? You're not alone. The homework debate has been raging for decades, with students, parents, and teachers all having different opinions on how much study time is actually beneficial.

The truth is, there's no magic number that works for everyone. But there are some research-backed guidelines that can help you find the sweet spot between academic success and maintaining your sanity.

How much home work should you be doing?

We're going to get to that in just a minute, but there are a few things to cover off first...

- Excessive studying is unlikely to dramatically increase your academic outcomes and it can be extremely bad for your physical and mental health too.
- Academic results are just one factor in your success, and too much study can reduce the time and energy you have for other resume-boosting activities.

Let's explore what the experts say about homework and how you can strike the right balance for your learning and wellbeing.

Why too much homework can backfire

Before we dive into the numbers, it's crucial to understand that more isn't always better when it comes to homework. In fact, excessive studying can actually work against you in several ways.

It can impact your health

Overdoing homework can <u>seriously impact your physical and mental health</u>.

If you're experiencing regular headaches, stomach problems, frequent illnesses, sleep issues, or feelings of anxiety about school, these could be warning signs that your workload is too heavy. Multiple studies have linked <u>excessive homework to these health problems</u>, and your physical and mental wellbeing should always come first.





It actually decreases your motivation

Doing <u>over the recommended limits</u> of homework could also be reducing your motivation and focus, which won't help you kick your academic goals. Think of homework like exercise – a moderate amount strengthens your academic muscles, but overdoing it leads to burnout and injury.

You'll also have less time to rest, exercise, work, spend time with family and friends, and just enjoy yourself, all important factors in your development and wellbeing.

What the research says

This information doesn't just come from disgruntled students - a heap of academic research has been done into homework, and some of the findings might surprise you.

Less homework doesn't mean less results

Here's something you might not expect: countries that assign the least homework often perform best academically. Korea, <u>Japan</u>, and <u>Finland</u>, for example, give students minimal homework, yet consistently rank among the top countries for reading, maths, and writing in international assessments.

It's about quality over quantity

Educational researcher <u>John Hattie</u> ranks homework at 279 from a list of 438 student achievement influences. Interestingly, he found the benefits of homework start at nearly none in primary school, but increase further into high school.

Quality homework and feedback is far more important than spending mindless hours covering the same work again and again.

"Homework that is meaningful and driven by student input is linked to improving attitudes, knowledge and student retention..."

You can have too much of a good thing

Research shows that once homework exceeds certain time limits, academic performance actually starts to decline. A 2015 study also found that middle school students assigned more than 90 to 100 minutes of daily homework began to see a fall in their maths and science test scores.

"Moderate amounts of time spent on homework are linked to better results, but a great deal ... of time spent on homework is actually less productive. This means when middle school students spend more than an hour and a half a night there is a correlation with lower scores."

- Cooper, et al., 2006

The homework sweet spot by year level

Based on multiple studies and expert recommendations, here are the optimal homework amounts for different school levels:

Middle school

Aim for up to one hour of homework per weekday. This gives you enough practice to consolidate classroom learning without overwhelming your developing brain.

Lower senior school

At this stage you should be able to handle between one and two hours daily. You're building stronger study habits and can manage slightly more complex work.

Upper senior school

By now your target should be around two hours per day. This prepares you for the increased academic demands you'll face if you continue to university.

Remember, these are guidelines, not rigid rules. For example, if you're taking more subjects than other students in your cohort, or if you're taking part in extra programs, then the amount of study you may have to do could increase.





Around assessment and exam time then you might find you're reaching the upper limits of the recommended homework times too, and that's normal, but it shouldn't be the norm for your entire school year.

Making homework work for you

The key isn't just about time - it's about making that time count. You don't need to do all your studying in marathon sessions. Break it up throughout your day and week.

Read your notes on the bus, watch educational documentaries that relate to your subjects, or discuss what you're learning with friends. Even casual conversations about your coursework can reinforce your understanding. Consider your natural rhythms too. Are you a morning person who thinks clearly at dawn, or a night owl who hits their stride after dinner? Schedule your most challenging homework during your peak energy times.

Setting yourself up for success

To make the most of your homework time, create a study environment that works for you. Find a space where you can focus without distractions, whether that's your bedroom, the kitchen table, or your local library.

Write a study plan and stick to it. Include regular breaks because your brain needs time to process and consolidate information. Research shows that after about 15 minutes of focused learning, your brain needs a few minutes to restore the neurotransmitters that help you concentrate.

Think of breaks as brain maintenance – they're not time wasted, they're essential for keeping your mind sharp. "After about 15 minutes of learning and practising something – such as the Pythagorean theorem in maths – the regions of the brain activated in spatial-numerical learning get fatigued and need to rebuild the neurotransmitters, such as dopamine, that get depleted. The restoration only takes a few minutes if the break is timely, but if they are pushed to stay with that same process for too long, stress builds, neurotransmitters drop way down and it will take twice as long to restore full efficiency to that area of the brain."

When to seek help

If homework is taking over your life, it's time to reassess. You should still have time for exercise, hobbies, work, family and friends. These activities aren't luxuries – they're essential for your development and mental health. If you're consistently struggling to complete homework, speak with your teachers. They can help you develop better study strategies or adjust expectations if needed.

One more thing to bear in mind

If you're contemplating university after high school, the expectation is that you'll be studying for around 40 hours per week, and that includes all of your lectures, seminars, and tutorials (it's the also the equivalent of a full-time working role).

If you're already doing 30 hours of school and 20+ hours of homework weekly, you're already exceeding university level workloads, and that's a red flag. Remember that work-life balance is important at all ages and is a great skill to master early in life.

Bachelor's, master's, doctorate: Your guide to university degrees

Are you thinking about your future study options and wondering about the different types of university degrees you can do? You've probably heard the words bachelor's, master's, and doctorate thrown around a lot recently if you're in your senior years of high school. But what do they mean and what's right for you?

Understanding your options can help you <u>set goals</u> and work out a long-term plan, so let's explore the basics of the three main types of university degrees.





Bachelor's degree: Your foundation

The first thing you need to know: you won't be able to pursue a master's or doctoral degree until you have an undergraduate qualification.

Bachelor's degrees are considered undergraduate degrees, and are what most students pursue straight after high school. They're a foundational qualification that provide knowledge and skills in a specific field of study. Here are some key points to know:

Depth of study

During a bachelor's degree, you'll typically focus on a major subject area of your choice, such as business, engineering, psychology, or arts. You might also have the opportunity to take a minor or second major or take individual subjects unrelated to your core degree.

Many bachelor's degrees can be combined into what are known as "dual degrees", allowing you to gain two qualifications in less time than it would take to study them separately.

Duration and requirements

Bachelor's degrees usually take around 3 to 4 years to complete full-time. Dual degrees are usually 5 to 6 years in length. To gain entry to a bachelor's degree, you typically need to finish high school.

Career benefits

A bachelor's degree gives you the knowledge needed for entry- and mid-level positions in various industries and lays the groundwork for further study down the track.

You'll also develop essential skills that can be taken into any industry, such as critical thinking, research abilities, and communication skills.

What about honours?

Honours is an optional research-based year on top of your bachelor's degree that deepens your expertise in your chosen subject. It's sometimes considered a bridge between undergraduate and postgraduate studies, ideal for those who might want to undertake a research degree in the future.

Honours are typically considered a higher level qualification than a bachelor's degree because of the depth of study and combination of coursework and research. Some people also find that an honours degree takes a more <u>skills</u>-based approach to study.

Master's degree: Specialisation and advancement

After completing a bachelor's degree, some students choose to pursue postgraduate study. This is where master's degrees come in.

The purpose of a master's degree is to build on the foundational of your first degree and allow you to specialise even further. They're more advanced than bachelor's degrees and can lead to specialised job opportunities or a career in academia.

Here's what you need to know about master's degrees:

Depth of study

Master's degrees typically delve deeper into specific areas within a field and may include coursework, research, and a thesis or project. For example, you might pursue a Master of Computer Science and decide to focus on Artificial Intelligence.

Duration and requirements

Master's degrees usually take 1 to 2 years to complete. They often require you to have a bachelor's degree in a related field for entry.

Career benefits

A master's degree can enhance your career prospects by providing advanced skills and specialised knowledge. It can open doors to higher-level positions and potentially higher salaries in your chosen field.





Doctorate: Pinnacle of academic achievement

Doctorates (or doctoral degrees) also fall into the postgraduate category and represent the highest level of academic achievement.

A doctorate is ideal for those passionate about research and making significant contributions to their field. You'll need to have earned an undergraduate qualification at minimum before you can apply to study a doctoral degree. A doctorate can either be academic or professional. Academic doctorates, as the name suggests, involve intensive research and the completion of a thesis or dissertation. Professional doctorates, on the other hand, are aimed at those looking to enter specific professions that require high-level knowledge and skills. Here's what you should know about pursuing a doctoral degree:

Depth of study

Doctoral degrees involve a combination of coursework, comprehensive exams, and either the completion of a dissertation or thesis or many hours of practical experience. You'll work closely with faculty mentors and peers to advance your knowledge in your area of study.

Duration and requirements

Doctoral degrees take anywhere from 3 to 7 years to complete, depending on the field and research requirements. While a bachelor's degree is the minimum needed for entry, completing a master's degree first can prepare you for what to expect and increase your chances of admission.

Career benefits

An academic doctorate prepares you for careers in academia and research and development, while a professional doctorate prepares you for specialised roles that require advanced expertise and leadership.

Forensic scientists apply scientific principles and techniques to analyse evidence from crime scenes. Their main job is to help law enforcement agencies solve crimes by examining and analysing everything from DNA samples to fingerprints, ballistics, and even digital evidence.

If you're fascinated by science, enjoy solving puzzles, and want to play a crucial role in the justice system, a career as a forensic scientist could be perfect for you.

What skills do I need as a forensic scientist?

- Excellent attention to detail
- Great problem solver
- Strong analytical and critical thinking abilities
- Excellent communicator
- Observant and patient
- Unbiased and fair
- Strong sense of justice
- Resilient with a strong stomach

What does the job involve?

- Examining crime scenes and gathering evidence
- Testing biological samples, chemicals, and materials
- Profiling organic compounds and biological materials
- Interpreting test results and drawing scientific conclusions

- Working with other professionals, including police officers and scientists
- Presenting findings to legal practitioners and law enforcement

Forensic scientists typically earn above-average salaries, with pay varying depending on experience, specialisation, and location.

How to become a forensic scientist

To become a forensic scientist, you'll typically need to complete a bachelor's degree in forensic science, chemistry, biology, physics, or a related scientific field. Many employers prefer candidates with postgraduate qualifications in forensic science or a relevant specialisation.

Many forensic scientists also pursue professional certifications and ongoing training to stay current with evolving technologies and techniques. Some specialisations may require additional qualifications, such as digital forensics or toxicology.
