

Policy Corner

Absent and Missing Children

We want to ensure a safe and smooth transition for your children at our service. It is important that all staff follow JAG processes to guarantee the safety and well-being of the children in our care. Practical and safe approaches are in place to facilitate transitions between home, school, and our service, ensuring records are accurate and confirming your child's presence. For Prep transitions, we provide additional care and support by appointing a Educator the collection of our Prep students. All team members are familiar with our standard arrival and departure processes, and any deviations are promptly communicated to the coordinator. In cases of non-arrival or absent children without prior notification, we follow up by phone with the school, parents and emergency contacts. If no confirmation can be obtained, the local police must be notified within 30 minutes of school finishing. Safeguarding the well-being of children and young people during their transition into our OSHC spaces is our top priority. We want you to feel confident that our service has established procedures in place to ensure a safe environment for all children and families.

Child Safe Standard

Child Safe Standard 9

Here at Bunyip OSHClub, we follow the Child Safe Standards which is a list of 11 standards that we need to implement to keep children safe. Child Safety Standard 9 is Physical, and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimizing the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed. We embed this standard having discussions with children about online safety, having a technology agreement form policy, monitoring children who use laptop for research purposes, conducting risk assessments, actively supervising both indoor/outdoor environments and by keeping the room clean and organized.
