PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

Dear Monty South Community,



What a term! We have had so many successes this term, in particular in the sporting arena. Congratulations to Lachie and all the staff who have participated in providing the wonderful opportunities that we have been able to partake in this term. Thank you also to all our parents who have helped in so many ways to make this term a success.

On the 21 August during our Pupil Free Day, the whole staff participated in a professional learning that was delivered by Berry Street. This is the beginning of our engagement with Berry Street for professional learning on the Berry Street Educational Model (BSEM). This will be an 18-month engagement where we will cover the four domains of: Body, Stamina, Engagement and Character, all anchored by Relationships. These five areas are pedagogical lenses that inform daily classroom learning. Although there is no single recipe for classroom success, we are striving collaboratively to unify the language, modelling, and relationships to meet the special and complex needs of all our students. Engagement with Berry Street is one of our actions from our Annual Implementation Plan - Student Wellbeing; which is part of developing a whole school approach to Mental Health and Wellbeing targeting programs and resources at Tier 1 and 2 support.

The above information leads me to another action from our AIP which was the appointment of our Mental health and Wellbeing Leader (MHWL), Tegan Caldwell. You may by now have had some interaction with Tegan. However, if you haven't, you may have seen some of the subtle changes that have occurred across the school, which have been initiated by Tegan. Under the mental health and wellbeing umbrella, Tegan's role is to: build staff capacity, advocate for and value student voices; research and implement evidence-based strategies; contribute to existing wellbeing teams; create clear referral pathways; collaborate and coordinate mental health support; promote a whole-school approach; and participate in communities of practice across our NEMA network. To be clear, Tegan's role is not clinical, she is there to provide the connections and pathways when student's need support.

Dogs on a Leash

Over this term, I have had a bit of communication from parents regarding dogs on school ground. It is fantastic that as a school community we are able to bring dogs onto school grounds, as they are a significant member of a family's structure and also great support for some of our students in getting to school. However, could I please ask that when you do bring your doggies onto school grounds that they are held by an adult and if possible keep them within a metre of your body. We have several students who are frightened of dogs and as you can imagine a large dog may appear very threatening to a little person. Thank you in anticipation of your support.

Mobile Devices

Over this term we have had several students who have used their mobile device to communicate with parents or others during school time. May I please remind you that it is an Education Department policy that:

"Personal mobile phones must not be used at Montmorency South during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

A mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as smart watches."

Our Policy is available on our website, again, thank you for your support in this matter.

TEACHING AND LEARNING UPDATE

FOUNDATION MATHS – Learning about Australian Coins

In the classroom:

Last week the Preps began learning about Australian coins. Many of our generous families donated coins to allow us to have an authentic learning experience. Students matched, sorted, and compared the different coins. We looked closely at the different features on each coin and noted the different Australian animals. We exchanged coins for goods in a play situation and began to understand the value of each coin. We worked towards adding together coins of the same value by skip counting. E.g., counting by 10's for a group of 10c coins.

What you can do at home:

In a society where technology is replacing coins and notes, it is important to expose your children to our currency and the concepts of change and quantity. When you go to the shops with your child, allow them to pay for things using physical money rather than using a card or phone. Having a jar of loose coins at home can be a wonderful way to teach children about the different coins in Australia. It can be fun to make piles/towers of matching coins and count by fives, tens, and greater amounts to add up money. One of our Prep Teacher's remembers their dad with a jar that contained some round fifty-cent pieces! You will have to guess which teacher that is!

IN OUR SAKG KITCHEN & GARDEN





In weeks 8 and 9 we enjoyed an Indian feast with naan bread, a pumpkin & spinach curry, vegetable bhajis, kachumber salad, yogurt raita and a chai spiced rice pudding. We learnt that India is the most populated country on Earth. A huge variety of breads, curries, sambals & chutneys are enjoyed in India. Our mildly spiced curry was too spicy for some but not spicy enough for others!

In week 10 we are making food from Florida, which is a melting pot of cultures with a delicious cuisine.

The students have enjoyed Florida style scachatta, Floribbean empanadas, Floribbean rice and beans, strawberry salad and a lime cheesecake. The word Floribbean is a 'blended' or 'portmanteau' word - combining Florida and Caribbean. Students were surprised to learn that alligator is a popular food in Florida.

 Floribbean empanadas 	
Serves 24 - 30 tastes Adapted from – latimes.com	
Ingredients Filling 2 tablespoons olive oil ½ green capsicum, diced 1 brown onion, diced 2 cloves garlic, crushed 1 can lentils, drained and rinsed 1 teaspoon cumin ground ½ teaspoon smoked paprika 1 teaspoon diced pickled jalapeños 1/2 cup currants or sultanas ¼ cup chopped green olives Salt and pepper to taste 4 - 5 sheets puff pastry 1 Egg for brushing, beaten	Equipment Baking trays x 2 Frying pan Knives Chopping boards Measuring spoons Sieve Measuring cups Grater Pastry brushes Pastry cutters
What to do: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pre heat oven to 180 degrees and line 2 large oven trays with baking paper • First make the filling by combining the capsicum, onion, garlic and oil in a frypan over a medium heat • Sizzle until the onion is translucent then add the spices and cook for 1 minute • Remove from the heat, stir through the rinsed lentils, jalapeños, sultanas and olives. Season with salt and pepper, mix well • Use a 15cm cutter to cut circles from the pastry. You should be able to cut 5 circles from each sheet, then piece together another 4 circles to give you 24 circles in total • Divide the filling evenly among the circles. • Use a pastry brush or your finger to brush beaten egg around the edges of each pastry • Then fold each pastry over to a ½ moon shape • Pinch along the edge to seal and enclose the filling, and seal tightly by crimping the edge with a fork • Arrange the empanadas on trays and brush lightly with the beaten egg • Bake for – 15 to 20 minutes or until golden brown and serve immediately 	

 Pumpkin and spinach curry 	
Serves: 4 Recipe by – www.loveandother spices.com	
Ingredients 500g pumpkin, cut into cubes 3 potatoes, peeled and diced 2 tablespoons oil ½ teaspoon black mustard seeds 1 red onion thinly sliced 1/2 green chili, sliced (optional) 1 stick cinnamon ½ teaspoon minced ginger 1 garlic clove, minced ½ teaspoon chilli powder (optional) ½ teaspoon turmeric powder ½ teaspoon ground cumin ½ teaspoon curry powder 1 small can coconut milk ½ cup water 2 -3 big handfuls baby spinach 1 teaspoon salt	Equipment Chopping board Knives Measuring spoons and cups Saucepan Sieve Serving plates
What to do: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heat a pan over a medium heat and add oil. • When the oil is hot, add the mustard seeds, cinnamon stick and sliced onions. Cook until the onions are translucent. • Add the ginger and garlic - cook for 1 minute. • Add the chopped pumpkin, potato, chili, turmeric, cumin and curry powder. Stir to coat the vegetables. • Add salt, green chili, coconut milk and the water. Bring to a simmer and cook with the lid on for 15 minutes or until the pumpkin and potato is tender. • Stir in spinach, cook 1 – 2 minutes or until the spinach is wilted • Serve while hot with fluffy basmati rice

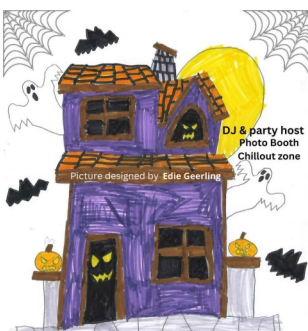
