Your child should be practising to read the same book at home every day. Before reading, revise the Speed sounds and the Heart words that can be found at the back of each book. Following this, you can: Talk about the book Look at the front cover and: Ask your child to read the title out loud, tracking their finger under each word as they read it. Introduce the characters your child will meet in the book Explore the illustrations. For example, ask: Can you point to the map? During reading Read and enjoy the book Ask your child to read out loud, tracking their finger under each word as they read Support your child if they are stuck by asking them to sound out and then blend the sounds together to read the word. When they have decoded the word, go back and re-read the sentence together. After reading Ask some of the "Questions to talk about" which can also be found at the back of each book. See if your child is able to recall some of the characters and/or key events. 		
MATHS 12345 67890	For the first four weeks of Term 2, students will be exploring the topic of Part-whole Numbers. Students will learn to identify and show different combinations for numbers to 5 and then to 10. For example, the following two parts make the whole number for 5: 0 and 5, 1 and 4, 2 and 3 . They will be using materials to partition numbers to 5 and then to 10 into two and three parts. For example, 10 is 5 and 2 and 3 (three parts) or 5 is 2 and 2 and 1 (three parts). We will not be introducing students to the symbols + - or = at this stage.		
INQUIRY	TOPIC: 'Making Healthy and Safe Choices' This week students will be introduced to the topic of 'Health and Safety'. Students will explore how they can relate these concepts to themselves and with making daily choices. This week students will also learn about some protective behaviours by identifying safety rules for their body and who they can talk to about them.
