Late last year, the Department of Employment released the **Industry Employment Projections over five years to May 2022**.

- There is the expectation that there will be a decline in employment for Manufacturing; Electricity, Gas, Water and Waste Services; and Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing.
- Employment in the services industries is expected to continue growing over the coming five years. Health Care and Social Assistance is projected to make the largest growth, followed by Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Construction, and Education and Training. Together, these four industries are projected to provide 61.5 per cent of total employment growth over the five years to May 2022.
